In 1982 the month of November was designated as National Alzheimer's Disease Awareness Month. At the time, fewer than 2 million Americans had Alzheimer's; today, the number of people with the disease has soared to nearly 5.4 million. Your blood sugar is a hormone that allows cells in your body to use sugar or glucose as a source of energy. 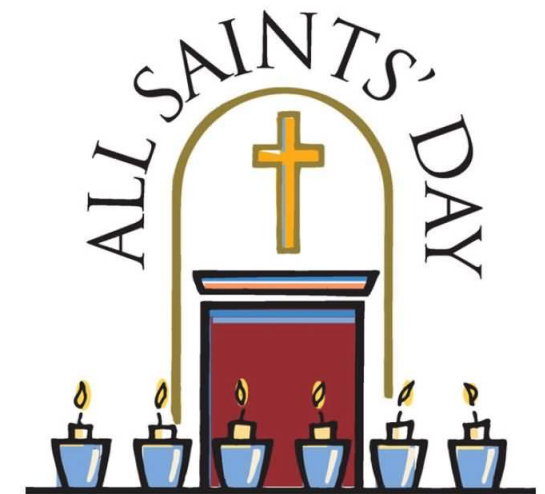

Celebrating All Saints

As we celebrate the Feast of All Saints today, our church family is also taking the time to remember God, all those whom we have lost to heaven – All Souls. In our Anglican/Episcopal tradition, whenever All Saints Day (November 1) is not celebrated on a Sunday, we simply transfer the observance to the next available. It is not however the custom to tinker with All Souls, seeing that the liturgy of the day, mandates that a requiem mass be said. Hopefully next year we will keep these celebrations apart. There is of course great wisdom in having a dual celebration seeing that we are recalling all the Saints, giving thanks to God for the many men, women and children who remain anonymous, those who are not mentioned at all in our liturgical calendar. Far too often, we mistakenly think of the saints as only those who appear on the stained glass windows of churches. Indeed they are many more and closer to our generation who lived exemplary Christian lives, whose names are not recorded anywhere, they are Saints as well. So let us thank God for them all, particularly those who names will be mentioned today.
