

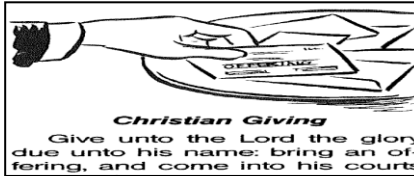

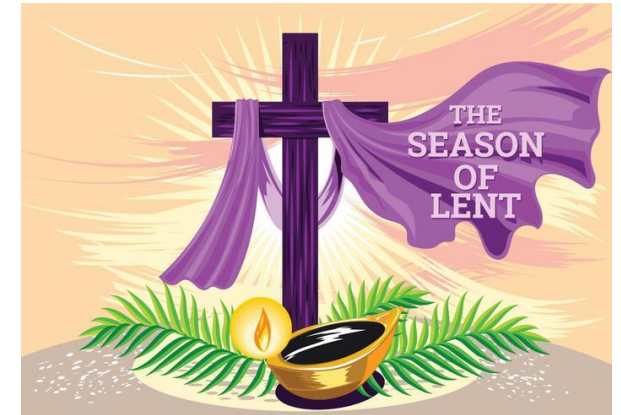

From the Rector's Desk

Bishop Howard's tribute to Billy Graham

Billy Graham died a few days ago and somehow the world seems a little colder to me. Maybe it's because I'll never hear him preach again except on videotape. Maybe it's because I already miss the prayers he offered up daily for us all. Maybe it's because in a world which seems utterly confused about the relation of God to humanity, Billy Graham gave us clarity and light. I miss knowing that he is still among us.

I read today that his body has been placed in a plywood casket made by prisoners at Angola Prison in Louisiana, one of our nation's most notorious prison facilities. The casket was placed in full view behind the pulpit in the chapel at Graham's home and retreat center. What better place for him to lie in peace? Preaching the gospel was the great man's calling. He preached with clarity and passion and warmth. He knew and loved the Lord and was unafraid to share that love with you and me.

Some of you have heard me tell about attending a Billy Graham crusade in my hometown, Raleigh, when I was sixteen years old. I was moved. My life was changed by it. I still mention that experience often when I teach or preach.

I already had a relationship with God in Jesus Christ before that night, but there can be no doubt that Graham's preaching softened the hard shell around my heart. There is no doubt either and that his words had the effect of God reaching through that hard shell to touch and change my life.

I didn't answer the altar call that night at Carter Finley Stadium by walking down to be prayed over by Billy Graham. But as the organ played and as people all around sang and rose from their seats to go down on the field my heart answered the altar call and I still remember — as do so many of you — the words of the hymn they were singing:

*Just as I am without one plea but that
Thy blood was shed for me
And that Thou bid'st me come to Thee
Oh lamb of God I come I come*

Thanks be to God for the life and ministry of Billy Graham. May he rest in peace and may light perpetual shine upon him.
