Together in Worship.... AMEN!

On Sunday, August 23, our church family sat down to hold group discussions on our worship together. The following is a summary of responses to the discussion questions. Some of the items listed were mentioned only once, and some were mentioned by several participants. Consensus answers were presented by a spokesperson from each group; these will be included in the December newsletter along with suggestions for the future.

1. What do we do as a part of worship you find especially meaningful?

- Communion.
- We are praying.
- We are praising God in song.
- We are having great sermons.
- The peace greeting.
- The fellowship between parishioners.
- Drums with music selections.
- Having a listening ear.
- Acceptance of others in the church like family.
- 2. What do we do now we might change to make worship more meaningful?
 - We should include children in the service on a regular basis, e.g., children's sermon.
 - We need to pray more together and for each other publicly.
 - Use the Gloria from Lift Every Voice.
 - Say The Lord's Prayer together standing and holding hands.
 - Choose songs that are easier to sing.
 - Encourage more congregational participation in prayers.
 - End the service with upbeat hymn sending us out into the world to serve. Also some are unsure when it is proper to leave.
 - Lay readers might pause during petitions.
 - Start on time.
 - Bring in other members of congregation to speak and perform.
 - Eliminate special groups taking communion first. (If not, explain in bulletin why others are going first.)
 - A more formal worship service following a more stringent Episcopal tradition.
 - More praise music.
- 3. What are we not doing as part of the liturgy you believe we might add as a regular or occasional aspect of our worship?
 - Create a guest relations ministry or expand the duties of the ushers. They should sit close to guest and provide guidance through the service.
 - Increase the voices in the choir and thus its volume and lower the organ volume.
 - Children's choir
 - Invite special guests or groups once a month.
 - Follow up with visitors via email, call, or a short letter.
 - Advertise our services and events in newspaper, community calendars, etc., ٠ particularly holy days and feast days.
 - Mid-week service ٠
 - Welcome committee
 - New member packet
 - Family and Friends day ٠
 - Have "carry out" bags for hungry / needy folks. Sunday School
 - Young people conduct the service once or twice a year.
 - Visiting each other outside of church.
 - Transportation of homebound
 - Better disability access
 - Children's ministry
