Spiritual Development of Our Youth

At St. Michael & All Angels, the spiritual development of our young people that begins with their baptism, is nurtured through our church school,

participation is church ministries and attendance at diocesan events and activities. We view our church school as just the beginning of a lifelong, spiritual journey where children and youth are nurtured in their faith, as well as the teachings and traditions of the Episcopal church. In addition to learning from the Episcopal Church Curriculum developed by the Center for the Ministry of Teachings at Virginia





Theological Seminary, our youth are involved in special performances during the

year, including a Christmas Pageant, Easter Program and Father's Day recognition. Our young people also grow spiritually through serving as lectors, greeters and ushers, and singing with the children's choir at one Sunday service each month.

The highlight of the summer for a few of our youth each year is to attend Summer Camp at Camp Weed, where they are able "to experience wholesome Christian fun in the great outdoors." As in 2015, two from St. Michael attended summer camp at Camp Weed this year: Daniel Erefah attended Session I for Rising $10^{th}-12^{th}$ graders, and Phaedra Hyche attended Session III for Rising 7^{th} and 8^{th} graders. This visit is Daniel's second visit as a camper. Daniel says he "enjoyed the experience at Camp Weed – meeting new people, interesting activities, and the spiritual development" and is "interested in returning as a counselor either at Happenings or at Camp Weed." He adds: "Camp Weed has certainly made an impact in my life. Thank you, St. Michael family, for all your support."

From The Episcopal Calendar — The Two Named Mary

Mary Magdalene is mentioned in the Gospels as being among the women of Galilee who followed Jesus and His disciples, and who was present at His Crucifixion and Burial, and who went to the tomb on Easter Sunday to anoint His body. She was the first to see the Risen Lord, and to announce His Resurrection to the apostles. Accordingly, she is referred to in early Christian writings as "the apostle to the apostles."

The honor paid to Mary, the virgin mother of Jesus Christ our Lord and God, goes back to the earliest days of the Church. Indeed, it goes back further, for even before the birth of her Son, Mary prophesied, "From this time forth, all generations shall call me blessed."

Besides Jesus himself, only two humans are mentioned by name in the Creeds. One is Pontius Pilate, Roman procurator of Judea from 26 to 36 AD. The other name is that of Mary. The Creeds say that Christ was "born of the virgin Mary."
