The Search Is Still On

For 11 weeks during the months of June, July and August, a committed group of St. Michaelites came together to read Presiding Bishop Michael B. Curry's book, Songs My Grandma Sang. The book study took place each Wednesday at 7:00 p.m. Each week, participants would take turns reading aloud from the chapter for that week, breaking into song when the text demanded, and offer their own thoughts and perspective on the readings. We were often amazed at the parallels we saw in our childhood experiences regardless of the country of our birth, and in current events within our city, state, nation and the world. And, yes, we identified parallels in the life of our own parish.

In Chapter 9 of **Songs My Grandma Sang**, Bishop Curry asks: How do you know when the Spirit is in your church? This question may be on the minds of many at St. Michael. After a lull lasting several months, in June our search committee resumed its work to identify candidates for consideration as our new Rector. To date, four priests have expressed an interest in joining our church family. Of the four, three have been interviewed via Skype and one by telephone. As the search committee continues to seek out interested persons, it is clear that the process is ongoing. And, after two and a half years, how do we know that the Spirit is in our church? Bishop Curry concludes that the Spirit lives where there is a community filled with love. "God is love, and where true love is, God himself is there." (The **KEY DATES** Hymnal 1982, #577)

> Undoubtedly, there is a sweet, sweet Spirit at St. Michael. Our church is a community filled with love – for each other and for our neighbors. Although we realize that the calling of a new Rector will mean we will no longer have Fr. Cal as our Interim, we know that as long as the Spirit is in our midst we will be filled with love and blessings.

Holy Father, we pray your grace and blessing upon members of the vestry and search committee as they journey on with you. Now and in the days to come, may they embrace your renewing Spirit, persevering in their labors with the knowledge that this, your holy planting, will produce a true harvest; through Christ our Lord. Amen.

World Day of Prayer for Creation

On **Thursday, September 1st**, Anglican, Roman Catholic and Orthodox Christians are being asked to join in the World Day of Prayer for Creation and to use the following month, leading up to the feast of St Francis of Assisi on October 4th, as a Season of Creation. The late Ecumenical Patriarch Demetrios introduced the Season of Creation into the Orthodox Churches in 1989. Last year Pope Francis designated the 1st of September as an annual World Day of Prayer for the Care of Creation; and this year he has called on Catholics to join "together with all Christians" in the Season of Creation.
