Our Worship and Stewardship

In our November newsletter, we summarized the responses about our worship together that were given by our church family during group discussions with Father Cal on Sunday, August 23, 2015. The following are consensus comments from the discussions, along with suggestions for the future.

What is most meaningful:

- Holy communion every Sunday
- Birthdays, anniversaries and travel recognition and prayers
- The welcome greeting at the entrance to the church
- The greeting during the Peace
- Wide congregational participation in the service
- Real life and focused sermons
- Structured Fellowship

Suggestions for the future:

- Quarterly Service for those unable to attend on their own. Service will be held at the church.
- Organize more church activities to encourage fellowship, such as picnic (Flip Flop Sunday), movie night, and other get-together events. This will help us connect as a church family.
- Involvement of members in church activities to learn more about the Church, possibly through rotation of functions and assignment of responsibilities to members who are willing to serve in new areas. More shared responsibilities.
- Adopt/Abandon concept is too prevalent and impedes progress.
- Have a midweek service.
- Encourage more congregational activities.
- Have more sacred/traditional music during worship.

As we live out our calling to be ambassadors for Christ in our daily stewardship, are you contributing your time, talent and treasure in sufficient measure to ensure the future we seek as a parish?
