

Father's Day

It is my firm belief that Father's Day observances ought to begin to reflect the changing reality as it pertains to fatherhood in 2018. Indeed, Father's Day is afforded almost scandalous treatment when compared to what we do as a society for Mother's Day – just look at the gifts selection and the promotion department stores engage in! Admittedly we still have too many fathers who have simply absconded and are no where to be found when important events occur in the lives of their children. There are of course historical reasons that help explain this apparent behavior that has regrettably resulted in pathological consequences for the family in the African American community. However, we have seen in recent times a deliberate effort on the part of some of our young fathers to reclaim their God-given roles. My heart warms every time I see a young father helping to care for a new born or just clutching the hand of a two year as they make their way across the street. Actually we have fathers doing much more than merely paying court mandated assistance for their children. Yes, we see fathers making the time to take their kids to ball games, to school and to church.

Let us here at SMAA recognize the fathers of our congregation, community and nation. At a time when the institution of the family continues to experience some threat, we thank God for those fathers who still understand the importance of remaining with their families, so that their sons could catch a glimpse of what they should become when it is their turn to be daddy.
