From the Rector's Desk

A Disturbing Development

Unless you have been holidaying on Mars (that's coming too), then you would have missed the absolute chaos that descended upon us as a society resulting from a policy decision of the current administration in the White House. Indeed, so mean spirited was this "policy" permitting the deliberate separation of children (even toddlers) from their mothers and fathers that unsurprisingly, it received widespread condemnation. In Washington, something of a rare bipartisan rebuke was meted out to the President and his team, for regardless of your political affiliation, the mistreatment of children should always trouble the consciences of all decent minded people. It would seem, that we managed to even offend the sensibilities of those way beyond our borders, with world leaders and Pope Francis all crying shame. My prayer is that as a society we will find it possible to provide shelter and respite to those who genuinely need a new beginning in their lives.
