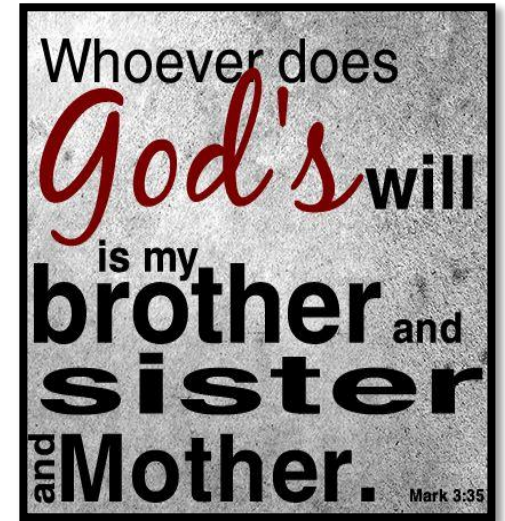

From the Rector's Desk

Saying Cruel things

I believe that we ought to be collectively outraged at the cruel things that are being publicly said sometimes, and even in the hearing of children. Undoubtedly and unquestionably there is a coarsening of our rhetoric, and tragically some among us feel the more caustic and bombastic we appear, it affords us some sort of advantage over those who do not share our opinions. I shudder to think what we can expect as a society, as we get closer to the November elections. Maybe in the realm of politics, such vilification is a necessary evil, for doing otherwise may result in concessions that could determine the outcome of a contest.

When however, this kind of disdain creeps into family relationships, then I know we have crossed a red line. A recent news story detailed the awful words that were penned by two children at their mother's passing! The obituary expressed sentiments I do not care to dignify nor repeat in this column. So how low can we go? Cruel things are being said to infants well before they could even grasp the nuances of the language process. What is equally tragic is that these little ones are prone to repeat what they have heard, thus destroying their innocence. Maybe it will have to take Christians like ourselves to condemn this kind of lewd behavior in the strongest possible terms, in order for decency to be restored. Failing that, more of the basic norms that govern our society will continue to erode. Something tells me that we Christians should begin in our families and serve notice that anti-social behavior will not be countenanced – certain things will not be said, and inappropriate language will not be tolerated.

I continue to be appalled at the vile and vicious things that are being said about our womenfolk in particular, with fat shaming as a milder form of ridicule. The tendency to disparage and dehumanize, has reached alarming proportions. Friends, we have to remind each other that we are all created in the image and likeness of a God who only creates what is good, with all of us being precious in his sight, regardless of creed, class or sexual orientation. I repeat, every human being is precious in God's sight and is loved by him. Jesus left us in no doubt about this all-encompassing love, that our good and gracious God holds in heart for his creation.

Let me remind you of an incident from the gospels where the so-called righteous attempted to go after a woman of easy virtue. This woman (some believe it was Mary Magdalene) had bought an expensive item of perfume and sought to anoint Jesus prior to his arrest, death and burial. The Pharisee who was entertaining him in his home at the time, said within himself, that Jesus could not be a true prophet otherwise he would have known what kind of woman was touching him! To which Jesus replied – "LEAVE HER ALONE". He looked beyond her human failings and saw her desperate need for love, care and attention.

Shall we seek to do the same, reminding ourselves that none of us is perfect or good and at the same time, endeavor to stop saying cruel things to and about each other?
