**Remembrance Project**

The idea for The Community Remembrance Project came from the St. John's Do Justice Ministry after a member learned of a similar initiative developed by an Episcopal Church in the Diocese of Tennessee. St. Michael and All Angels Episcopal Church and First Presbyterian Church have agreed to partner with St. John's on this project. The leadership team, made up of members from these three congregations, will look for other churches and organizations in our community to partner on this initiative. There are several ideas that could be included in the initiative. One is to erect a memorial plaque in Cascades Park remembering African American victims of lynching in Leon County between 1897 and 1937. The four men were taken from the Leon County Jail – near where the park is – and lynched. The project could also include a service of repentance, reconciliation and healing, possibly at the Cascades Park amphitheater. Working together, the partners involved in this initiative will develop a plan on how to move forward. There will be plenty of opportunities for people to get involved. Our baptismal covenant calls us to strive for justice and peace among all people, respecting the dignity of every human being. We believe this is an important part of that work. The most recent General Convention of The Episcopal Church (2015) identified racial reconciliation and healing through prayer, teaching, engagement and action as a top priority. Presiding Bishop Michael Curry has been leading this movement.

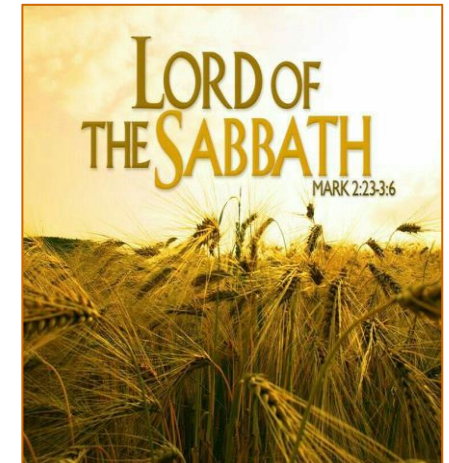

## From the Rector's Desk

### A Sobering Reminder

Whilst serving on the island of Bimini in the Bahamas, I did have in the congregation a gentleman by the name of Ansil Saunders. Ansil often boasted that one of his special customers was Dr. Martin Luther King Jr who frequently slipped away to the Bahamas so he could read and reflect. Ansil tells the story that Dr. King actually composed portions of his famed "I have a Dream Speech" on his boat, while he should have been sports fishing- (Ansil confessed to me that he was quite happy to take his money for doing nothing that day). I keep remembering Ansil for another reason – he was the quintessential churchman every priest hopes he or she would discover in their congregation. Ansil always seemed ready to share his resources with the church family, always offering to purchase something for the church. One day he showed up at the church with his friend and fellow sport fisherman Frank Hinzey trying to persuade me to give them permission to cover the entire area of the sanctuary in marble!! I said yes thinking such a scheme was way too outlandish and expensive to undertake. By the next week, large crates began appearing and before long the project was complete at no cost to the church.

What I remembered Ansil mostly for was his faith and how readily he spoke of his relationship with His God whom he communed with each day on the open seas. Ansil would speak hours on end about how the Hurricane Season occurring every year, caused him to reflect on the awesome power of this God who every now and then, gave us something of a display through the acts of Mother Nature. He would say to us who gathered in his work shed, that he remained baffled at those who deny the existence of God and would quote the Psalmist David saying – it is the fool who says there is no God. He would conclude his musings by reminding us that our world has its fair share of tin gods who occasionally strut across the globe and before long they are gone – while our God reigns from everlasting to everlasting.

So with the premature start of Hurricane Season, those sanguine thoughts of Ansil returned as tropical storm Alberto swept through the panhandle, leaving us drenched for the better part of last week. Others were less fortunate, for in Alabama there were reported mud slides and forced evacuations in other places. Flash flood warnings were issued for Tennessee, Kentucky, Illinois, the Carolinas and as far away as Virginia – just after the first storm. Could I encourage you to make use of the prayer we shall use to begin the service today – this prayer of protection? Let us make use of it as often as we could as Hurricane Season unfolds.
