From the Rector's Desk

Rekindling ~ **Finding the Fire Again.**

Today is the birthday of the Christian Church – it is the Feast of Pentecost. As we read again the story of this awesome day, we are perhaps left in no doubt as to the transformative power of the Holy Spirit, for look what it did to a frightened bunch of men and women. Not only did their courage return, but Peter who had never preached a sermon before, stood up and proclaimed the gospel of Jesus with such conviction, that three thousand souls were added to the Lord that day! He was truly on fire for the Lord as the report in the Acts of the Apostles makes plain. The question for 21st century believers is, are we on fire for this Lord who called us into his service? Admittedly sometimes that fire grows cold and we are left wondering what we could or should do to rekindle the flame.

Here are three quick suggestions. Firstly, let us break the cycle, that pattern of behavior threatening to ensnare us, leading us into rut. We can drive to work (most times) without even thinking where to turn. Caution – when a routine turns into a rut, it may lead to a downward spiral. Is this true of our spiritual lives? So here is a suggestion, maybe we should all try to rekindle the fire of Pentecost in our lives, by breaking whatever cycle it is that is threatening to entrap us. Let us try it with our daily lives. Try getting up at a different hour, change your diet, turn off the TV and read a book instead. Could we do it?

Secondly, let's go back to basics. A fire begins going out the minute you stop kindling it. Friends, we often quit reading and studying and reaching for new experiences, becoming content with recycling old stories of the past and the fire goes out within us. A suggestion, as we seek to go back to basics, let us take the time to read our bibles (trust you have one) and make time to pray even as engage in act of charity. So, pick any book of the bible, one with an unusual name and study it. Also pray without using words and in the silence, allow God to speak to you.

And thirdly – stay connected. Someone once said, it is hard to be a recluse and maintain a healthy enthusiasm for living. So, some people who withdraw from community become inwardly focused and chronically depressed. Remember beloved, that Christianity is always personal but never individual. So, while it is true that each of us has own destiny to fulfil, our God calls us to live together, work together and worship together in community, to the honor and glory of His name. If we do, then the spark of faith within us will rekindle and spread throughout our bodies, as it enlightens both our hearts and minds.
