

From the Rector's Desk

A Somber Moment

This past week, we observed as a nation and people, the 50th Anniversary of the assassination of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. It was Alexis McMillan who drew my attention to MLK50BellToll, where congregations and campuses with bells, were being invited to toll their bells 39 times to honor the number of years Dr. King did dwell here on earth and also call attention to his enduring legacy. When we stop and consider the achievements of this Baptist Minister, we are awed by his contribution, indeed, how he single handedly did help to change the course of our nation's trajectory, and became for a while, the conscience of America. Yes, they were many who preceded him in the Civil Rights Movement, but not many were able to match his soaring rhetoric, nor his ability to call our nation to repentance for the sins of the past. An acknowledged disciple of Mahatma Gandhi, Martin skillfully interwove his understanding of the Christian gospel with a militancy that advocated non-violence in the face unmitigated provocation. Poked and prodded by those who tried to break his spirit, and even an attempt on his life prior to his assassination, could not cloud his vision of the promised land - a better America that remains a dream still to be realized. This dream many across our world call to remembrance every time and everywhere racism and injustice rear their ugly heads. In a time in which so much gets forgotten so quickly (everything becomes a victim of the next news cycle), we who still honor Martin's memory, owe it to ourselves and the generations to come, to keep his dream alive. The Jewish nation has taught us the importance of one's history and the retelling of one's story. So for them, the Exodus is not just one of the first five books of the Pentateuch (of our Bible), but a real experience that their forebears endured – one that they remember for all time. I pray that the chiming of the bells across our nation last week did serve a similar purpose.
