BUILDING WITH CHRIST: St. Michael Looks to the Future

**September 29<sup>th</sup>, the FEAST OF SAINT MICHAEL AND ALL ANGELS**, held major significance for our parish; on that day, St. Michael and All Angels celebrated 136 years of ministry to the Tallahassee community, the Appalachee region and the Episcopal Diocese of Florida. Our celebration of this milestone began Friday evening, September 28<sup>th</sup> with the **Make a Joyful Noise Concert**, featuring Sounds of St. Michael with special guest Edward Bennett, in the sanctuary; and Positive Vibes Redeemed band, which filled the parish hall with sounds of reggae and soca that had



everyone praising the Lord on their feet and in their seats. Of course, no special event at St. Michael happens without mouthwatering food and there was plenty of that!

Saturday, September 29<sup>th</sup> was marked with a **Quiet Day**, a time for prayer, devotions, meditation and reflection. Led by The Rev. Dr. Jerry Smith, rector of Holy Comforter Episcopal, participants were reminded of Paul's defence (The Acts of the Apostles 22), noting that people have a zeal for God but no personal relationship with Him. Through reading of scriptures and meditating on the Word, we were encouraged

to get personal with God and not be afraid to hear what He wants from and for us. Further, we were cautioned not to accept the grace of God in vain but to commit to a ministry of surrender – standing firm and staying faithful. We were left with the question: How can we be partners with and ambassadors of God to bring about change? We may



have found one answer in the capital campaign, **Building with Christ**, that was launched on Sunday, September  $30^{th}$ .

Our current parish facilities have served the community for 50 to 60 years and the time is right for renovation and expansion. Although plans have been temporarily changed to allow for our congregation's recovery efforts following Hurricane Michael, St. Michael's Capital Campaign continues strong and is centered around the creation of a new "Perpetual Saints Trail." Inscribed bricks and medallions will be purchased by congregants or sold to friends and supporters of our parish and placed as a sidewalk-like historical marker stretching from Melvin Street to the sanctuary behind our current parish hall kitchen. Dr. Laurie's address was well received as were the handouts he provided with additional information.

Past meets Present — On November 3, Tallahassee Hidden History project will commemorate the extraordinary lives of Antonio, George and John Proctor, free black men of the 18th and 19th centuries. On November 4th, members of the Proctor family will worship with us at St. Michael in recognition of our shared histories. Senator John E. Proctor was a congregant at the original St. Michael Mission in the 1930s. As an early church historian noted, "Though Senator Proctor was quite aged and slow of step, he would walk to church every Sunday and sit on the last row, participating in songs and chants in a very soft voice but always offering a gentle smile as he was greeted by everyone."
