From the Rector's Desk

Power of Love

Our Presiding Bishop, The Most Reverend Michael Curry is proving to be such a blessing for the Episcopal Church. His ministry is rooted and grounded in the gospel of the Lord Jesus Christ. We are learning that he has released another book, in which he seeks to focus on the "Power of Love" how we Episcopalians can attempt to live our lives still in a hate filled world. This call for love may seem anachronistic to many who live here in these United States, for look what we have had to deal with recently – rancor of the worst kind, occasioned by the hate filled rhetoric that dominated our political discourse. Thank God the mid term elections are finally behind us. Hopefully we can return to some semblance of dialogue that is devoid of the hate that spewed from both sides of the political divide. Yes as a nation and people, we need to make our way to living differently with the love principle serving as a guide.

Advent Season

My intention is to do a teaching series during the Advent Season as a way of reminding us all of what we believe and teach in the Episcopal Church. Hopefully, this will be helpful to those who have begun to visit with us in recent times and perhaps want to know more about our Episcopal faith.

Liturgical Changes

To the best of my knowledge, there is no liturgical reason why we should stand for the recital of the psalms – it is our practice to do so for the reading of the gospel. The aforementioned will be phased out. With respect to the weekday celebration of the Eucharist, a contemplative form will be added, where instead of using the readings appointed for the day, we shall read from a non-scriptural writing such as the Presiding Bishop's book.

Capital Campaign Program

Hurricane Michael has hampered the plans of the Capital Campaign Committee forcing those who are serving to reschedule a number of planned activities including the deadline for the receiving of pledge cards, the consecration of those pledges and the training envisioned to help us all become more effective at soliciting donations from our friends, family members and the wider community.
