From the Rector's Desk

Power of Love

Our Presiding Bishop, The Most Reverend Michael Curry is proving to be such a blessing for the Episcopal Church. His ministry is rooted and grounded in the gospel of the Lord Jesus Christ. We are learning that he has released another book, in which he seeks to focus on the "Power of Love" how we Episcopalians can attempt to live our lives still in a hate filled world. This call for love may seem anachronistic to many who live here in these United States, for look what we have had to deal with recently – rancor of the worst kind, occasioned by the hate filled rhetoric that dominated our political discourse.
