still too many lapsed members of SMAA whom we need to engage. 2019 must be the year when we evangelize in new and creative ways, when we reach out to our own people. Maybe we ought to also reach out to churches in and around us who do not claim our Episcopal faith, but as Presiding Bishop Michael Curry reminded us, they are also part of the Jesus Movement. I am sure we can enrich each other's experience through engagement, meaningful interaction, and yes accepting invitations whenever they come are our way.

From the Rector's Desk

Annual General Meeting

Immediately following the celebration of the Eucharist today, we shall gather in the Fellowship Hall for our AGM. Leslie Baker has promised me that we shall be fed, so no one should think of leaving this all-important meeting, that our canons and regulations dictate we must have.

I have chronicled in my rector's report, the highlights of 2018 – and they were several. In most parishes of our size, limited expectations are like a recurring theme – don't over extend, just stay in the maintenance mode. That memo obviously was missed by our church family, for look what we did in the last calendar year? We began January by inviting the clergy of our region to join in my official welcome to the parish (installation) and before long, we were planning for our Lenten observance and more importantly, our 136th Anniversary celebrations, that included the launch of a Capital Campaign that envisioned us seeking to raise as much as half a million dollars! My clergy brethren with whom I have shared the details of this ambitious project, have given me the odd look, as if to say, have you all at SMAA lost your collective minds? And yet we are able to report today, that we have collected in pledges and financial gifts some \$225,000 and more – to God be the Glory. We might have been further down the road, if it were not for hurricane Michael and the savage blow it struck in many counties and communities including our own. Mindful of what some among us did suffer, we decided to be a little more deliberate in our approach. Equally encouraging was the word from Laureatte Scott our Treasurer, that many of us fulfilled our pledges, no doubt doing so at some personal sacrifice. This little church we call SMAA, is set to defy the odds in 2019. So let us use the time together today, to look back in thanksgiving and to seek the Lord's guidance for what He would have us do for Him in 2019.

Broadening our Horizons

I want us to be bold – I say that and am reminded that our Lord's disciples prayed for boldness. They asked Jesus to strengthen their faith so that the obstacles that stood before them dissipate. Jesus responded, if you have faith as a grain of mustard seed, you will be able to say to a mountain, move from here to there and it will move, and <u>nothing</u> will be hard for you to do. Let us seek to truly live out our faith in 2019 and begin to trust our God even more – remember he is our provider. Whilst we are expanding the boundary of our faith experience, let us endeavor to bring others along with us. There are
