From the Rector's Desk

A Different Experience

Last Thursday evening, John Grayson and I attended a "Lenten Service" at Greater Mt. Zion Primitive Baptist Church, where the Rev. James Vaughn serves as pastor. As it turned out, we were both there on account of the preacher for the evening, the Rev. Tan Moss, who serves in Jacksonville. Needless to say, before long, we were captivated by the rhythmic singing of the guest choir, and when Tan took the pulpit, we became Baptists for the moment. Tan, an extraordinary preacher, spoke about fasting and praying, but that portion of the sermon had to wait, until he was done talking about the sport of boxing and how athletes such as Mohamed Ali, prepared themselves for that pugilistic sport. He contrasted their approach with what we Christians do, as we prepare ourselves for spiritual battles, utilizing the combined disciplines of fasting and praying. His text was actually taken from the Book of Esther (4:12-15), where she admonished fellow Jews to fast and pray so that the Lord of Heaven who listen to their intercession and spare them from the evil plot of the conniving Haman. In true Baptist preaching style, Tan incorporated our present political reality in his sermon, and adjured the congregation to keep placing their petitions before God, so that those prayers would be answered too, as was done for the Jews of Esther's day.
