

From the Rector's Desk

Praying and Waiting

Last Thursday, we celebrated the Feast of the Ascension in guiet fashion, since this feast day finds less and less resonance with those who observe it. I remind you however, that Ascension Day commemorates the return of Jesus to the Father. Nine days must pass until the Day of Pentecost, when we celebrate the coming of the Holy Spirit. This nine day period is sometimes called Ascension Season, for it is the conclusion of the Great Fifty Days of Easter. For our Lord's disciples, it was a time of remaining in Jerusalem (Jesus ordered them to remain). Yes, a time to wait and a time to pray. This should remind us twentyfirst century followers of the necessity to do likewise. Now praying and waiting sounds pretty good, until we remember that our society has little patience with those who decide to wait and pray. Let's face it friends, ours is an action – oriented culture, action oriented to a fault, so much so that many of us become stressed if we have to wait on anything or anyone for any lengthy period of time. Our culture is no friend to prayer either except possibly prayer that reinforces the status quo. I suggest to you brethren, that prayer reminds us of our dependence on God, even though the culture that surrounds us is uncomfortable with any idea of dependence. Yes, our culture is independence oriented almost to a fault, so we find that many among us live and die in considerable isolation from one another!!

Back to the Ascension story, where we encounter those waiting and praying disciples, gathered there in Jerusalem, anticipating the promised power from on high – so they wait and they pray. Yes, they wait and pray not only out of obedience, but out of a desire that is holy and good. Ours is a culture that accepts desire, only to trivialize it. So our TV commercials sing hymns to hamburgers and celebrate the glories of dish detergents. Our politicians – some of them – incite our fears and jealousies, rather than challenge us to desire justice. Our poets and artists and film makers are not honored unless they bend our desires in the direction of violence or the sentiment of what is popular in our culture. So tragically, we find ourselves often trapped between the trivial and the tragic, leaving so little room to truly wait and pray, because of the incessant distraction that surrounds our lives.
