On the other hand, if social and other programs are being funded by just a few, then the effectiveness of the afore-mentioned could easily be endangered of those “sponsors” who lose their inclination or enthusiasm.

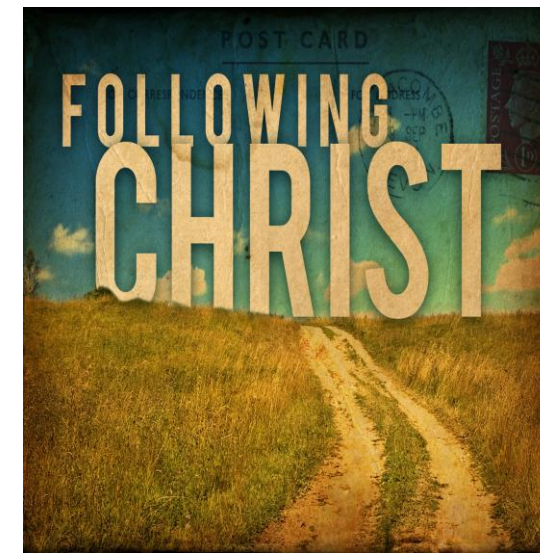

From the Rector's Desk

Church Revitalization – and what we can do about it.

There is this mistaken notion among some believers, that all we have to do is pray and then all that we ask for, will be provided bountifully. I trust that we recognize that there is nothing magical about prayer. As the Epistle of James reminds us, faith without works is dead. Meaning that after we have made intercession, we have to rise from our knees and then go and do what the Lord has revealed to us. And sometimes that revelation makes clear that we simplify what we must do, for life is complicated enough. So prayer is only the starting point – the work we must do, will require an intentional examination of our mission and vision. More simply put, we have to see what Jesus is calling us to do. It is highly recommended that a careful study be made of the words we find in the Great Commission, especially verses 19 & 20 of the 28th chapter of Matthew's gospel. Jesus said to his disciples and indeed to us, go into all the world, preach and proclaim the gospel, I shared with you. Those first century believers took those words literally, for not only were they ready to tell others of the love of God as exemplified in the life of Jesus, but demonstrated in real ways what loving God and loving neighbor actually means – spiritualizing the gospel does not help. A few examples will probably help us better understand what they did. Firstly, they opened the "door" of their community to all – Jews, Gentiles, bond, free, male and female. Then they looked at the actual needs of those who came – widows, orphans, sick and the poor. After that, they encouraged the believers of means, to share what they had with others. So we are told in the Acts of the Apostles, wealthy folks sold what they had and gave it all to the apostles. The church would have prayed and the Lord through these generous acts of fellow believers, provided. So no one was in need. Can we learn something here from the unselfish approach of these followers of Jesus? I am sure many of them would have had to do some personal reflection and or wrestling, for giving up what we have, after we have worked hard at achieving our life goals, is never an easy option.

However with the maturing of their faith, those believers came to realise that caring and sharing were both integral to their witnessing, and often that exercise required a measure of sacrifice. Perhaps someone has to help us get to the point in our lives, when we see this world's goods as a blessing that we freely received and therefore should be ready
