Supporting Parish Efforts

As part of my devotions this past Friday morning, I read again the portion of scripture we find in St. Paul's first letter to the church in Corinth (1 cor. 12:12-26). Indeed it was a impassioned plea for church unity, and Paul in this poignant piece of writing, likened the church to the human body. So he says-suppose the foot should say, "because I am not a hand, I do not belong to the body", it does belong to the body none the less. Paul chose other body parts to hammer home the point of interdependence, all belonging to one another so everything be done in a cohesive manner in the church. He concluded, "God has combined the various parts of the body, giving special honor to the humbler parts, so that there might be no sense of division in the body, but that all its organs might feel the same concern for one another. If one organ suffers, they all suffer together. If one flourishes, they all rejoice together." I want to borrow this concept employed by St. Paul and use it to remind us of the necessity of supporting all that we do together here at SMAA. In fact, we have a number of efforts being planned from now until year's end. Let us seek to employ this motif that Paul so handily shared with the believers at Corinth.
