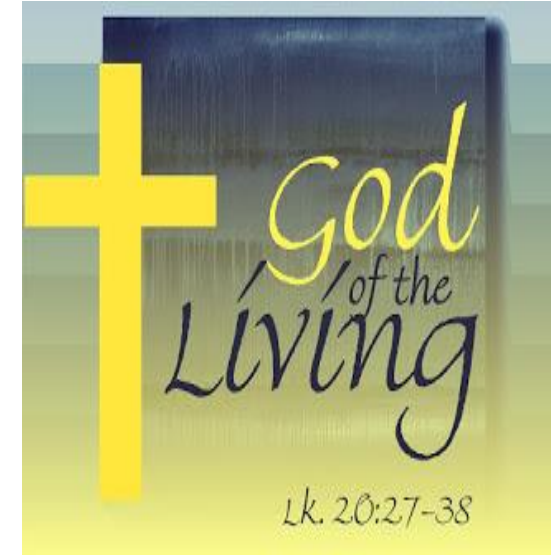

## From the Rector's Desk

### **Honoring our Veterans**

Tomorrow we will pause and collectively reflect on the service and sacrifice of those who served our nation in the past and those who did so recently, sometimes paying the ultimate price. A former parishioner from St. Philip's in Jacksonville, often described his fellow veterans as 'those who gave their all and then some'. Ken Johnson, a veteran of the Vietnam War, often fumed every time he heard a politician use the phrase – a grateful nation. He would use some 'french' to describe how he felt about that kind of insincerity. He would then proceed to reference the shocking stories about the fate of homeless vets; those who continue to be victimized by the incompetence of the VA and the ongoing trauma experienced by those who are plagued by PTSD.

I suppose we can sort of identify with Ken's frustration and why he continues to rail against how grateful we truly are as a nation. The truth is, because of the selfless service of these men and women, we are able to live in freedom and peace. Today we shall pay a small tribute to our own list of veterans – Dourest Robinson, Dr. Felita McNeil, Zollie White II, Verona Satchell and the Rev. Laughton Thomas. Dourest has kindly consented to address us briefly.
