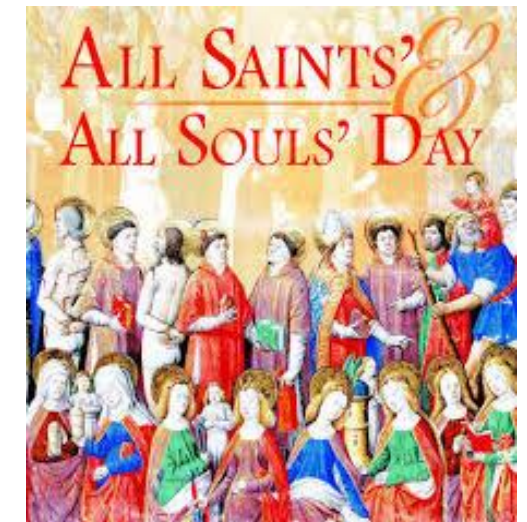

From the Rector's Desk

**Returning to In-Person Worship**

We have not been able to gather here in the sanctuary for over six months!! In the meantime, video services filled that void, and we are truly grateful to Monique, Cassandra, Daniel, DL, Ivana and Chris for their individual contributions. We are indebted to Darryl Tookes, Edward Bennett and more recently, Althemese Barnes and Eugenia Chapman for sharing their musical gifts with us, as well as those have who served as lectors, preachers, or worship leaders. I believe that this has been a season of deep frustration for all of us as we longed to see each other, share the peace with one another and gather in the fellowship hall for conversation and refreshment. The aforementioned were denied us, because of the COVID-19 pandemic that continues to bedevil our daily existence even here in Tallahassee. Those regions of our nation that were initially spared, are now facing the ravages of this deadly enemy that has robbed us of some 225,000 fellow citizens! Our hearts broke for those who were not permitted to be present for the passing of their loved ones! All of a sudden, we became more acutely aware of those standing near to us in the supermarkets and the line at the post office. Restaurants, bars and barber shops were off limits and living rooms became temporary classrooms for those who chose to home school their kids. And yes, our church buildings across the Diocese resembled abandoned buildings rather than places of worship as they were intended to be. Today we are boldly making the effort to return to in-person worship with all the various safety protocols in place. We owe a tremendous debt of gratitude to the vestry and especially Charlie Clark (junior warden) and his team who prepared the facility for this moment. Our communications team made up of Monique Alleyne, Ivana Kenny Carmola and Cassandra Werner made sure that each Sunday morning we heard the word proclaimed and were able to participate in the liturgy from afar. They are providing us now with the opportunity to have our services live-streamed. The plan is to make available a recording of the service, for those who may not be able to join us at the ten o'clock hour. I ask that you pray that all will go well and that in time more of us will be encouraged to join us for in person worship.

#### ***A Reading from the Book of Revelation 7:9-17***

I looked, and there was a great multitude that no one could count, from every nation, from all tribes and peoples and languages, standing before the throne and before the Lamb, robed in white, with palm branches in their hands. They cried out in a loud voice, saying, "Salvation belongs to our God who is seated on the throne, and to the Lamb! And all the angels stood around the throne and around the elders and the four living creatures, and they fell on their faces before the throne and worshipped God, singing. "Amen! Blessing and glory and wisdom and thanksgiving and honor and power and might be to our God forever and ever! Amen." Then one of the elders addressed me, saying, "Who are these, robed in white, and where have they come from?" I said to him, "Sir, you are the one that knows." Then he said to me, "These are they who have come out of the great ordeal, they have washed their robes and made them white in the blood of the Lamb. For this reason they are before the throne of God, and worship him day and night within his temple, and the one who is seated on the throne will shelter them. They will hunger no more, and thirst no more; the sun will not strike them, nor any scorching heat; for the Lamb at the center of the throne will be their shepherd, and he will guide them to springs of the water of life, and God will wipe away every tear from their eyes."

### *Celebrant continues*

Holy and gracious Father: In your infinite love you made us for yourself; and, when we had fallen into sin and become subject to evil and death, you, in your mercy sent Jesus Christ, your only and eternal Son, to share our human nature, to live and die as one of us, to reconcile us to you, the God and Father of all.

He stretched out his arms upon the cross, and offered himself, in obedience to your will, a perfect sacrifice for the whole world.

On the night he was handed over to suffering and death, our Lord Jesus Christ took bread; and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, "Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me."

After supper he took the cup of wine; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said, "Drink this, all of you: This is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me."

Therefore we proclaim the mystery of faith:

### *Celebrant and People*

Christ has died. Christ has risen. Christ will come again.

### *The Celebrant continues*

We celebrate the memorial of our redemption, O Father, in this sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving. Recalling his death, resurrection, and ascension, we offer you these gifts.

Sanctify them by your Holy Spirit to be for your people the Body and Blood of your Son, the holy food and drink of new and unending life in him. Sanctify us also that we may faithfully receive this holy Sacrament, and serve you in unity, constancy, and peace; and at the last day bring us with all your saints into the joy of your eternal kingdom. All this we ask through your Son Jesus Christ. By him, and with him, and in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit all honor and glory is yours, Almighty Father, now and for ever. *Amen.*
