

A Reading from the Acts of the Apostles (19:1-7)

While Apollos was in Corinth, Paul passed through the interior regions and came to Ephesus, where he found some disciples. From the Rector's Desk

What about our Souls?

I have reading recently an article penned by the Rev. Dr. Russell J. Levinson Jr., rector of St. Martin's Church in Houston, Texas. In it, Dr. Levinson seeks to encourage his parishioners and readers to make participation in the life of the church a priority. He submits that 1. active

participation in the life of the church improves one's health. 2. active participation in the life of the church is a key characteristic of being a follower of Christ and 3. our coming together is a sacrament (an outward and visible sign) that attests to the Lordship of Jesus.

He goes on to ask some poignant questions:-

a. who or what is Lord over your calendar.

b. who or what is Lord over your check book.

c. who or what is Lord over the ethical and moral decisions you are called to make day by day.

d. who or what is Lord over your relationships, your thoughts, your business decisions, your sex life, your encounters with people who are different from you.

He concludes, can you see, now, why the regular 'coming together' with other Christians – to pray, to worship, to read and learn about scripture, to serve is so very important in living out the Lordship of Christ in our lives?

So the initial question asked, what about our souls? What about this life in Christ we are all called to live? Here's the prescription that he suggests – allow Jesus to be Lord, not your phone, or television, or work, or hobbies, not your friends, or your temptation or your wallet or your favorite sports team or part time – yes not even your children or spouse. No he says, let Jesus be Lord and all the rest will fall in place. I promise you that.
