

From the Rector's Desk

Praying for our Nation and People

When bishops make their pastoral visits to congregations, they often take the time to enquire after the health of the parish. Sometimes they may even summon the vestry to meet with them, prior to divine worship. Bishop Howard in his recent visit did not require such a meeting, but instead suggested that he and I spend some time reflecting on our shared ministries and how individually we have managed to 'weather' the storms that 2020 turned out to be. We looked at the restrictions laid upon clergy as we sought to minister to those placed in our spiritual charge. The Bishop for his part, has to care for the entire diocese, confirming, affirming and receiving those who desire to become part of the Episcopal Church, as he did last Sunday when he welcomed Porche Whitby, into full fellowship here at SMAA. He also has to exercise pastoral care to all of his clergy and their families, and of course, administer the diocese. His is a burdensome task and that is why we must always pray for our Bishops.

Bishop Howard introduced a number of years ago, an award system, whereby he sought to recognize those lay persons and clergy who offered exceptional service to the Diocese. Our sister Geraldine Roberts received such an award at the hands of the Bishop last Sunday. Despite a multiplicity of tasks he must complete, the Bishop's chief responsibility is to pray for all who serve with him, both clergy and lay – and by extension, our nation and people. So Bishop spent the time reflecting on what God was saying to us even in this time of crisis, we as a church and country – yes as we seek to determine His will. We recommitted ourselves to praying for our Episcopal Church family, our bishops, clergy and people, but especially for our nations as together we claw our way out of the various crises that have recently enveloped our nation – COVID-19, an uncertain economy and the threat to social order. Brethren I invite you to join the Bishop and I, as we make daily intercession for our nation and people.
