The Nicene Creed

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From the Rector's Desk

Mother's Day

I want to begin by offering a special greeting to our mothers, grandmothers, and the surrogate mothers to whom we owe so much. I am not at St. Michael's today on account of Henry and Proche' wedding that took place yesterday in Atlanta. Fr. Wallace from St. John's was kind enough to supply for me today. As I recall that conversation, he said, you got to take your wife with you and show her a good time, while you're there. So yes, I am able to help Genevieve celebrate Mothers' Day away from all of you wonderful mothers at SMAA. Not to worry (and God willing) come next year, we shall make up for all the celebrations we missed. Today, let us celebrate the mothers of our church, community, and country. Happy Mothers' Day again. Today is a day of special thanks giving to God for the love, nurture, and care that you mothers so unselfishly provide. While Mothers' Day is not a "Holy Day" (according to our liturgical calendar), yet we pause and give thanks to God for mothers everywhere. Mothers' Day is a business bonanza for those peddling gifts that we feel obligated to purchase. I've said enough on that subject; here's another reason why we should observe Mothers' Day. I believe every mothers' day we are afforded the opportunity to reflect also on the "mothering" attributes of our God (in some cultures, the female pronoun is used to describe Him). And if we think clearly and soberly about these "mothering attributes" of our God, we would come to realise that this day, could both be celebratory and sober all at the same time. Indeed there is great joy and celebration when a child is born into a family. That woman becomes a mother, and she is never able to retire from that role, ever. The raising of children is sometimes successfully attempted by men, but mothers complete that task with such grace, purpose and love, that we know that what they do, brings unbridled joy to the heart of our God. That is why also when a child(ren) is estranged from his or her mother, she is consumed by undeniable grief and pain, particularly if that estrangement ultimately results in that child's demise. I believe, and am sure you do too, that our God has a special place in His heart for mothers everywhere. Unfortunately, for some mothers, this day is but a lonely experience, for their child/children are either far away or are simply refusing to connect with the one who brought them into this world. Equally painful for some of our womenfolk, is their inability to conceive - and I know our God shares their pain and
