When the day of Pentecost had come, they were all together in one place. From the Rector's Desk

In Pursuit of Justice

The meeting to launch SMAA's Justice Ministry Team, attracted just seven (7) persons. I would imagine that more of us are concerned about the effort to ensure that justice is not only done in our city, but <u>seen</u> to be done. Don't remind me, I know how preoccupied we all are these days. Some of us are dealing with illnesses in our families, some planning graduation celebrations, while the rest of us are cautiously deciding whether it is safe to venture out again in the wider community. However, the justice we seek on behalf of those who are made to suffer every day, cannot wait. We are all fairly conversant with what happened in Nazi Germany, as many Christians looked the other way when persons were bullied, forced to surrender their properties/belongings and when they refused, were killed! I believe that the lesson learned during that truly dreadful period of history in Germany, was, when good people remain silent, bad things happen. Indeed, this is America, and we would have little tolerance for the excesses that occurred in the 1940's in Germany. However we do have concerns, or should have. Here is a sampling of three concerns that were expressed at last Wednesday's meeting:-

- (i) a member of the group (female) intimated that she was afraid to cut her hair, lest she be mistaken for a black male and be targeted by the police!
- (ii) another said that she used to live in Atlanta, and feared for the lives of her sons on account of the serial killings!
- (iii) yet another opined we have to save young black lives, even if it takes telling our sons each day what they must do when they encounter the police.

What a way to live? Certainly as a society we are better than this. This is why the

Capital Area Justice Ministry was conceived and why through small groups within our churches, we can pursue justice.
