A Reading from the Book of Proverbs (31:10-31)

A capable wife who can find? She is far more precious than jewels. The heart of her husband trusts in her, and he will have no lack of gain. She does him good, and not harm, all the days of her life. She seeks wool and flax, and works with willing hands. She is like the ships of the merchant, she brings her food from far away. She rises while it is still night and provides food for her household and tasks for her servant-girls. She considers a field and buys it; with the fruit of her hands she plants a vineyard. She girds herself with strength, and makes her arms strong. She perceives that her merchandise is profitable. Her lamp does not go out at night. She puts her hands to the distaff, and her hands hold the spindle. She opens her hand to the poor, and reaches out her hands to the needy. She is not afraid for her household when it snows, for all her household are clothed in crimson. She makes herself coverings; her clothing is fine linen and purple. Her husband is known in the city gates, taking his seat among the elders of the land. She makes linen garments and sells them; she supplies the merchant with sashes. Strength and dignity are her clothing, and she laughs at the time to come.

She opens her mouth with wisdom, and the teaching of kindness is on her tongue. She looks well to the ways of her household, and does not eat the bread of idleness. The Nicene Creed

Here is yet another reflection shared with me recently that I am happy to pass on:-

Our Writer asks – Is God Real?

As a Christian, we praise God for His goodness, grace, and mercy. However, as soon as something tragic happens in our lives, the question that pops into our head is – why did God allow this misfortune or mishap to occur in my life? If our faith is easily shaken, then we may even begin to wonder if God is real and whether he truly loves us! Some of us become so desperate to have our prayers answered immediately, that we attempt to bargain with God – Lord if you heal my child, I will never miss church again! If you grant me that promotion, I will pay my tithes from now on! If you save my marriage, I will seek to be faithful the rest of my days! So when our prayers are not answered on time, or the manner in which we thought they should have, we just blame God. God does not want us to bargain him – who are we to think so presumptuously! Rather He wants us to trust Him, for His knowledge is infinite and He knows what is best for us and will answer our prayers according to His gracious will.

So friends, disabuse your minds of that idle thought, asking whether God is real – He is!! And if you are patient enough, He will reveal His purposes for your life. Pray for more faith to not only believe God, but also trust Him completely. God never said, "Understand Me – no he says, "Trust Me". For those of us wondering about what He wants us to do, remember God will not send us on a mission that he will not accompany us on. The word says in John 15:7 – "if you remain in Me and My Words remain in you, ask whatever you wish, and it will be done for you."
