Therefore I have uttered what I did not understand, things too wonderful for me, which I did not know. "Hear, and I will speak; I will question you, and you declare to me.' I had heard of you by the hearing of the ear, but now my eye sees you; therefore I despise myself, and repent in dust and ashes." And the Lord restored the fortunes of Job when he had prayed for his friends; and the Lord gave Job twice as much as he had before. Then there came to him all his brothers and sisters and all who had known him before, and they ate bread with him in his house; they showed him sympathy and comforted him for all the evil that the Lord had brought upon him; and each of them gave him a piece of money and a gold ring. The Lord blessed the latter days of Job more than his beginning; and he had fourteen thousand sheep,

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six thousand camels, a thousand yoke of oxen, and a thousand donkeys. He also had seven sons and three daughters. He named the first Jemimah, the second Keziah, and the third Keren-happuch. In all the land there were no women so beautiful as Job's daughters; and their father gave them an inheritance along with their brothers. After this Job lived one hundred and forty years, and saw his children, and his children's children, four generations. And Job died, old and full of days.

For it was fitting that we should have such a high priest, holy, blameless, undefiled, separated from sinners, and exalted above the heavens. Unlike the other high priests, he has no need to offer sacrifices day after day, first for his own sins, and then for those of the people; this he did once for all when he offered himself. 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From the Rector's Desk

Be Anxious for Nothing

I cannot help but think that our grand baby probably heard Sheila Hickman last Sunday morning when she tried to suggest that Lilly needed to hurry up and get here, so Penny and me could get back home! As fate would have it, Cassandra and Daniel's bundle of joy arrived a couple of hours later. So many of the grandparents here at SMAA suggested to me, that there is nothing comparable to the joy experienced when a grandchild is born. That joy Genevieve and I are basking in, as well as Stan and Carol (Danny's parents). The attending physician suggested the date of the fifteenth, but as the little one tarried, all the old stories of first babies came to mind - how they tended to nullify the best projections, even as they add layers of anxiety to family members doing the countdown. Uncertainty has a way of spawning justifiable worry that could easily lead to one questioning the doctor's opinion. Like every potential grandparent, those thoughts lingered for a minute, and then the words of Jesus came to reassure me, "be anxious for nothing." To be brutally honest, the promise of those words gets called into question, particularly when your eyes are on the calendar and there is no noticeable change in the mother's condition, despite the usual assurances of those attending to her. It is human to respond and react in that way. Indeed, it is equally human to be anxious and to allow even momentarily, that cause for worry. It was the same Jesus who said that a woman in travail (labor pains), is greatly distressed because her hour has come, but when the newborn arrives, the joy that floods her heart and soul, all but wipes away the memory of the unbearable pain just endured.

Such was Cassandra's experience, one that is always shared by every potential mother – the first cry of the newborn is like music to the ear.

Even as we waited and prayed as a family, my mind strayed – I thought of the other anxieties that play havoc with our sensibilities and how eventually we end up realizing as people of faith, that there is nothing else we can do in moments like those, but to wait on the Lord – yes lean on one's faith. A faith that suggests that when uncertainties prevail upon us, there is only one destination, one resort, one place to go. The psalmist David was right – listen to him again. "It is better to trust in the Lord, than to place one's confidence in anything else."

So, when the word came that the little one had safely arrived last Sunday afternoon, mine was an indescribable joy – I shed a tear and thanked the Lord for reminding me why I should always put my complete faith and trust in Him – yes why we should be anxious for nothing. A dear friend of mine, John Melville sent me a caption complete with a cartoon figure that said – Yup, God did it again!
