The Nicene Creed

From the Rector's Desk

Falling in Love – Another reflection shared with me.

Our writer says:-

When we fall in love (perhaps for the first time), we are all excited, energized and eager to tell the world about how awesome our newfound love is!! What we do? We sing their praises to anyone who will listen – and we often seem to walk on air – nothing else seems to matter. Overtime, the excitement wanes for a multitude of reasons. Initially we begin to take the person for granted (he or she will always be there) and yes with all the hustle and bustle of life, somehow without realizing it, a gulf appears, some awkwardness follows by what we call a “distance,” developing. Before long we begin to wonder why this relationship that we so cherished, now lacks the excitement and buzz it used to portend. What went wrong we ask ourselves –knowing full well what we contributed to its demise.

This scenario is replicated in the life of us Christians who “fall in love” with Jesus as some of us describe our conversion. We are so exuberant in our newfound faith that we cannot help but share what this new life In Christ means for us. But then life happens, and we get all busy with careers and whatever else is happening in our lives, and before long, our love relationship with the Lord suffers. Before long we stop reading our bibles, attending worship, and yes even praying. Indeed the number one ingredient that is absolutely necessary for the maintenance for any “love relationship” is communication. Our relationship with the Lord of our lives is no different. As soon as we stop communicating with Him, we drift away. Do you remember the story in the gospels about Peter, who walked on water – but as soon as he took his eyes off of Jesus, he began to sink? So what should we believers do? I tell you – nurture your love relationship with Jesus every day through prayer, reflection and a reading of God's holy word. That is the only way we will remain rooted and grounded in our faith – remain in our love relationship with the Lord.
