

THE LESSONS

A Reading from the Book of Zephaniah (3:14-20)

Sing aloud, O daughter Zion; shout, O Israel! Rejoice and exult with all your heart, O daughter Jerusalem! The Lord has taken away the judgments against you, he has turned away your enemies. THE HOLY GOSPEL

Gospeler: The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Luke (3:7-18)

People: Glory be to thee, O Lord

John said to the crowds that came out to be baptized by him, "You brood of vipers! Who warned you to flee from the wrath to come? Bear fruits worthy of repentance. Do not begin to say to yourselves, "We have Abraham as our ancestor"; for I tell you, God is able from these stones to raise up children to Abraham. Even now the ax is lying at the root of the trees; every tree therefore that does not bear good fruit is cut down and thrown into the fire." And the crowds asked him, "What then should we do?" In reply he said to them, "Whoever has two coats must share with anyone who has none; and whoever has food must do likewise." Even tax collectors came to be baptized, and they asked him, "Teacher, what should we do?" He said to them, "Collect no more than the amount prescribed for you." Soldiers also asked him, "And we, what should we do?" He said to them, "Do not extort money from anyone by threats or false accusation, and be satisfied with your wages." As the people were filled with expectation, and all were questioning in their hearts concerning John, whether he might be the Messiah, John answered all of them by saying, "I baptize you with water; but one who is more powerful than I is coming; I am not worthy to untie the thong of his sandals. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire. His winnowing fork is in his hand, to clear his threshing floor and to gather the wheat into his granary; but the chaff he will burn with unquenchable fire." So, with many other exhortations, he proclaimed the good news to the people.

THE SERMON

THE NICENE CREED

(Another reflection shared with me). Our writer says: It does not matter how old you are, how wealthy you may be, how clever you appear to others, or even your zip code, there is sure to be moments in your life that ultimately cause you pain. For indeed, some days will prove to be more challenging than others. All of us without fail come to experience that particularly difficult trial that may cause us to throw up our hands and say, "I'm tired and done". Yes, I'm tired of heartache, pain, bitterness, betrayal, false friends, gossip, financial woes, family issues, and what passes for church these days. Don't be too hard on yourself, it is human to want to run away when our burdens are simply too heavy to bear. Sadly, for even some of us Christians, the pain, the darkness, the doubt becomes so deep seated, that we make that agonizing decision and end it all. Actually suicide is a permanent solution for a temporary problem. Will those who ultimately take their lives not see the face of God? We don't know, for God and God alone judges the hearts of his people. Here is the sad truth, those who before taking their lives, often find themselves in a dark place, thinking that there is no way out and perhaps, should seek the help from the One who cares deeply for everyone of us. I remind you that our God is a God love who truly cares for each and everyone of us, and He knows what we are going through. The psalmist David, says he is tender hearted – compassionate to those who are made to suffer in this life. The truth is, we are never alone – Joshua said – "Be strong, Be brave, Be fearless. You are never alone (Josh 1:9). When you are at your lowest, your self esteem almost gone, and the emptiness in your soul is choking the life out of you, dump those feelings. Here is what the Psalmist David did say – "weeping (sorrow, pain) may stay for a night, but rejoicing (joy) comes in the morning." Instead of feeling that you are done, trust God to hold your hand and then watch Him usher in a whole new era in your life. The apostle Paul had these comforting words for the believers at Philippi (4:5-7)" The Lord is near. Do not be anxious for nothing, but in every situation, by prayer and petition with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus."
