Gospeler: The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Matthew 2:1-12

In the time of King Herod, after Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea, wise men from the East came to Jerusalem, asking, "Where is the child who has been born king of the Jews? For we observed his star at its rising, and have come to pay him homage." When King Herod heard this, he was frightened, and all Jerusalem with him; and calling together all the chief priests and scribes of the people, he inquired of them where the Messiah was to be born. They told him, "In Bethlehem of Judea; for so it has been written by the prophet: "And you, Bethlehem, in the land of Judah, are by no means least among the rulers of Judah; for from you shall come a ruler who is to shepherd my people Israel." Then Herod secretly called for the wise men and learned from them the exact time when the star had appeared. Then he sent them to Bethlehem, saying, "Go and search diligently for the child; and when you have found him, bring me word so that I may also go and pay him homage." When they had heard the king, they set out; and there, ahead of them, went the star that they had seen at its rising, until it stopped over the place where the child was. When they saw that the star had stopped, they were overwhelmed with joy. On entering the house, they saw the child with Mary his mother; and they knelt down and paid him homage. Then, opening their treasure chests, they offered him gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. And having been warned in a dream not to return to Herod, they left for their own country by another road.

Sermon

The Nicene Creed

Looking into the Future

Not many of us are sorry to see 2021 go, for look what we were left having to deal with this past year. It was tragedy upon tragedy, as daily we were reminded of how many fellow Americans we lost to COVID and its evil sisters, the variants that created havoc across our world. Indeed nothing was saved, almost all forms of entertainment were plagued – the theater, art shows, professional and college sports. We were not spared in the church either, as we watched our weekly attendance dwindle to an average about twenty (20) souls per week here at St. Michael and All Angels. Just to show how widespread all of this has been, just recently the National Cathedral had to close its doors for fear of becoming a super spreader! Normally at Christmas, thousands upon thousands visit our Cathedral as guests. Other denominations had to make that painful decision as well. Fortunately, technology came to our rescue. Because of live-streaming, those who stayed at home across the country were still able to “worship” from their couches. Let me pay tribute to those who still managed to attend here at St. Michael and All Angels despite the on-going threat of infection, particularly the young and those with pre-existing conditions. We here at St. Michael and All Angels owe a great debt of gratitude to the Altar Guild, Music Ministry and those who introduced live-streaming to us – Cassandra and Daniel Werner and those who kept us going, after the Werners left for Nashville – DL LaSeur, Gabrielle Hickman and more recently Eugenia Chapman, Leslie and Sean Warren. We are all grateful to those who served as lectors faithfully “showing up” when they were assigned to so do. We owe a debt of gratitude to our wardens, vestry, and Elizabeth Humes, who saw to it that despite our challenges, the work of ministry continued uninterrupted.

Then there was the steeple project, that was completed in time for the Christmas Celebrations (thanks to Charlie Clark). While our Capital Campaign remained somewhat dormant, we are truly grateful to Linda Dilworth, Cassandra Werner and Delois Brown for keeping this vision alive among us.

So what does the future hold? I have no crystal ball to gaze into – do you? What we do share together is this belief that our God remains in control of all that happens in our world. So let us remain ardent in our prayers and faithful in our support for the work of His Church in the world. Pray for St. Michael and All Angels as well as our Diocesan Family as we prepare to elect a new bishop – a new spiritual leader for us Episcopalians across North Florida – this will happen in May.

Most of all I urge that you pray incessantly for our nation and people that we will see a cessation to all the poisonous rhetoric that has invaded our national discourse, and instead, we will return to some sort of civil discourse again.
