THE LESSONS

The people sit

A Reading from the Book of Isaiah (6:1-8, [9-13])

In the year that King Uzziah died, I saw the Lord sitting on a throne, high and lofty; and the hem of his robe filled the temple. Seraphs were in attendance above him; each had six wings: with two

they covered their faces, and with two they covered their feet, and with two they flew. And one called to another and said: "Holy, holy, holy is the Lord of hosts; the whole earth is full of his glory." The pivots on the thresholds shook at the voices of those who called, and the house filled with smoke. And I said: "Woe is me! I am lost, for I am a man of unclean lips, and I live among a people of unclean lips; yet my eyes have seen the King, the Lord of hosts!" Then one of the seraphs flew to me, holding a live coal that had been taken from the altar with a pair of tongs. The seraph touched my mouth with it and said: "Now that this has touched your lips, your guilt has departed and your sin is blotted out." Then I heard the voice of the Lord saying, "Whom shall I send, and who will go for us?" And I said, "Here am I; send me!" And he said, "Go and say to this people: "Keep listening, but do not comprehend; keep looking, but do not understand.' Make the mind of this people dull, and stop their ears, and shut their eyes, so that they may not look with their eyes, and listen with their ears, and comprehend with their minds, and turn and be healed." Then I said, "How long, O Lord?" And he said: "Until cities lie waste without inhabitant, and houses without people, and the land is utterly desolate; until the Lord sends everyone far away, and vast is the emptiness in the midst of the land. Even if a tenth part remain in it, it will be burned again, like a terebinth or an oak whose stump remains standing when it is felled." The holy seed is its stump.

A Reading from Paul's First Epistle to the Corinthians (15:1-11)

Now I would remind you, brothers, and sisters, of the good news that I proclaimed to you, which you in turn received, in which also you stand, through which also you are being saved, if you hold firmly to the message that I proclaimed to you—unless you have come to believe in vain. For handed on to you as of first importance what I in turn had received: that Christ died for our sins in accordance with the scriptures, and that he was buried, and that he was raised on the third day in accordance with the scriptures, and that he appeared to Cephas, then to the twelve. Then he appeared to more than five hundred brothers and sisters at one time, most of whom are still alive, though some have died. Then he appeared to James, then to all the apostles. Last of all, as to one untimely born, he appeared also to me. For I am the least of the apostles, unfit to be called an apostle, because I persecuted the church of God. But by the grace of God I am what I am, and his grace toward me has not been in vain. On the contrary, I worked harder than any of them—though it was not I, but the grace of God that is with me. Whether then it was I or they, so we proclaim and so you have come to believe.

Once while Jesus was standing beside the lake of Gennesaret, and the crowd was pressing in on him to hear the word of God, he saw two boats there at the shore of the lake; the fishermen had gone out of them and were washing their nets. He got into one of the boats, the one belonging to Simon, and asked him to put out a little way from the shore. Then he sat down and taught the crowds from the boat. When he had finished speaking, he said to Simon, "Put out into the deep water and let down your nets for a catch." Simon answered, "Master, we have worked all night long but have caught nothing. Yet if you say so, I will let down the nets." When they had done this, they caught so many fish that their nets were beginning to break. So they signaled their partners in the other boat to come and help them. And they came and filled both boats, so that they began to sink. But when Simon Peter saw it, he fell down at Jesus' knees, saying, "Go away from me, Lord, for I am a sinful man!" For he and all who were with him were amazed at the catch of fish that they had taken; and so also were James and John, sons of Zebedee, who were partners with Simon. FROM THE RECTOR'S DESK

Black History Month

There are some among us who feel that maybe this will be the last time that we shall be able to celebrate Black History Month as we have grown accustomed to. Why the despondency and despair you ask? Well, I don't quite agree with the gloom and doom being projected, although we should take note of the ominous and certainly dark developments of recent times. Case in point, the bomb threats directed at twelve (12) of our Historically Black Colleges on the first day of this annual observance!! Was this just coincidence – what you think? A friend of mine and a lecturer at Edward Waters University in Jacksonville, Dr. Brian Seymour, texted me the disturbing news, that his campus was closed on account of the perceived threat – I could not fathom what I was reading. During my sojourn in Jacksonville, St. Philip's Episcopal Church developed a wonderful relationship with E.W.U. and each October, together we hosted a fund-raising concert for the school. E.W.U. choir is legendary, and so the entire community came to be serenaded while taking the opportunity to support the good work this institution was doing for the countless number of young people who came from far and wide – even the Caribbean, to get a good college education. So yes, I was distressed.

Of course equally disturbing was the news that right here in Florida (Orlando area), there were two Neo-Nazi gatherings! Okay, freedom of association and right to assemble are enshrined in our nation's constitution – but a Neo-Nazi rally that shouted anti-Semitic slogans? I can see why our Jewish brethren dwelling in that corner of our State were rightfully concerned, and so should every African, Asian, Latin, and Native American! And finally the vitriol in the media that accompanied the announcement that President Biden was going to keep his word and nominate a Black woman to fill the upcoming vacancy on the Supreme Court. The Supreme Court like Congress ought to reflect the growing diversity of our nation. I am dismissing the efforts to remove literature from our schools that record our history detailing the treatment meted out to our forebears, upon whose backs this country was built, simply because I have more faith in our young people and their spirit of curiosity. Those revisionists attempting to deny our history by banning books, perhaps have not heard of Amazon.com.

So yes, ten, fifty, a hundred years from now, a more enlightened population will better understand why Black History Month must have a permanent place on our nation's calendar.
