

THE LESSONS

A Reading from the Book of Deuteronomy (26:1-11)

When you have come into the land that the Lord your God is giving you as an inheritance to possess, and you possess it, and settle in it, you shall take some of the first of all the fruit of the ground, which you harvest from the land that the Lord your God is giving you, and you shall put it in a basket and go to the place that the Lord your God will choose as a dwelling for his name. FROM THE RECTOR'S DESK

Continue to pray for the Ukrainian People.

Bishop Howard has asked that we keep in prayer the people of Ukraine. The Bishop says "join me in prayer that the Ukrainian war might conclude swiftly and with justice, that the innocent might be shielded from harm and that nationalistic aggression, abusive power and self-justifying violence, might cease." Let us continue to make intercession for the small Anglican congregation of Christ Church in Kyiv and the many Ukrainian Americans who are truly distressed at this time.

Disciplines for Lent

We Anglo-Catholics observe Lent in three (3) ways – by fasting, praying and by engaging in acts of self-denial. I urge you to ensure that you engage in some form of discipline that takes attention away from yourself and places it on the sacrificial life we are called to live.
