

THE LESSONS

A Reading from the Acts of the Apostles (9:36-43).

Now in Joppa there was a disciple whose name was Tabitha, which in Greek is Dorcas. She was devoted to good works and acts of charity. At that time she became ill and died. When they had washed her, they laid her in a room upstairs. Since Lydda was near Joppa, the disciples, who heard that Peter was there, sent two men to him with the request, "Please come to us without delay." So Peter got up and went with them; and when he arrived, they took him to the room upstairs. All the widows stood beside him, weeping and showing tunics and other clothing that Dorcas had made while she was with them. Peter put all of them outside, and then he knelt down and prayed. He turned to the body and said, "Tabitha, get up." Then she opened her eyes, and seeing Peter, she sat up. He gave her his hand and helped her up. Then calling the saints and widows, he showed her to be alive. This became known throughout Joppa, and many believed in the Lord. Meanwhile he stayed in Joppa for some time with a certain Simon, a tanner.

THE NICENE CREED



A truly remarkable Story – (shared by a sister in Christ).

This Dr. Abraham, a well-known cancer specialist, was on his way to an important conference in another city to receive an award in the field of medical research. He was excited about the recognition he was about to be afforded. So he boarded his flight. However, two hours after they took off, the pilot announced that he was going to have to make an emergency landing on account of a technical problem. Afraid that he was going to be late, Abraham went to enquire from an attendant at the check-in counter, "who told him, he had a ten(10) hour wait." Abraham rented a car and decided to drive to his destination, which was four (4) hours away. Almost as soon as he left, the weather became stormy, and in the downpour, he missed the important turn off he was supposed to make. So driving on a deserted road, feeling hungry, and yes tired, he frantically looked for any sign of civilization. He stopped at a small house that he spotted along the way, knocked on the door and asked the woman who opened it, to use her phone. She had none, but invited him inside, advising that he should wait out the storm. The host offered him a meal but first asked him to join her in prayer - he declined. He told this lovely lady, that he believed in hard work, not in prayer. From where he sat, sipping some tea, the doctor observed the woman pray every now and then at a baby's crib. Sensing her need, the doctor asked what was the child's ailment, and suggested that if God ever listened, then he would heal the child. The woman explained that a rare form of cancer was slowly consuming the child's body and she was told that a certain Dr. Abraham could possibly cure the child! Stunned and speechless, Dr. Abraham began to weep. He uttered words that previously he might not have said - "God is great." He recounted to the woman, the sequence of bad events, the malfunction of the plane, the delay, the thunderstorm, and the fact that he virtually got lost along the way. The woman listened as he spoke in rueful tones, and assured him that God answers prayer and was giving him a chance to leave behind his bondage of a materialistic career pursuit, and instead give some of his time to a poor helpless woman who had nothing but rich prayers to offer. What a story!
