THE LESSONS

The people sit

A Reading from the Acts of the Apostles (16:16-34)

With Paul and Silas, we came to Philippi of Macedonia, a Roman colony, and as we were going to the place of prayer, we met a slave-girl who had a spirit of divination and brought her owners a great deal of money by fortune-telling. While she followed Paul and us, she would cry out, "These men are slaves of the Most High God, who proclaim to you a way of salvation." She kept doing this for many days. But Paul, very much annoyed, turned and said to the spirit, "I order you in the name of Jesus Christ to come out of her." And it came out that very hour. But when her owners saw that their hope of making money was gone, they seized Paul and Silas and dragged them into the marketplace before the authorities. When they brought them before the magistrates they said, "These men are disturbing our city; they are Jews and are advocating customs that are not lawful for us Romans to adopt or observe," The crowd joined in attacking them, and the magistrates had them stripped of their clothing and ordered them to be beaten with rods. After they had been given a severe flogging, they threw them into prison, and ordered the jailer to keep them securely. Following these instructions, he put them in the innermost cell and fastened their feet in the stocks. About midnight Paul and Silas were praying and singing hymns to God, and prisoners were listening to them. Suddenly there was an earthquake,

so violent that the foundations of the prison were shaken; and immediately all the doors were opened and everyone's chains were unfastened. When the jailer woke up, and saw the prison doors wide open, he drew his sword and was about to kill himself, since he supposed that the prisoners had escaped. But Paul shouted in a loud voice, "Don't harm yourself, for we are all here" The jailer called for lights, and rushing in, he fell down trembling before Paul and Silas. Then he brought them outside and said, "Sirs, what must I do to be saved?" They answered, "Believe in the Lord Jesus, and you will be saved, you and your household." They spoke the word of the Lord to him and to all who were in his house. At the same hour of the night he took them and washed their wounds; then he and all his entire family were baptized without delay. He brought them up into the house and set food before them; and he and his entire household rejoiced that he had become a believer in God.

On the night he was handed over to suffering and death, our Lord Jesus Christ took bread; and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, "Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me."

After supper he took the cup of wine; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said, "Drink this, all of you: This is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me."

We celebrate the memorial of our redemption, O Father, in this sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving. Recalling his death, resurrection, and ascension, we offer you these gifts.

Sanctify them by your Holy Spirit to be for your people the Body and Blood of your Son, the holy food and drink of new and unending life in him. Sanctify us also that we may faithfully receive this holy Sacrament, and serve you in unity, constancy, and peace; and at the last day bring us with all your saints into the joy of your eternal kingdom.

All this we ask through your Son Jesus Christ. By him, and with him, and in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit all honor and glory is yours, Almighty Father, now and for ever. *Amen.*

And now, as our Savior Christ has taught us, we are bold to say,

THE LORD'S PRAYER

FROM THE RECTOR'S DESK

Living our Faith

Friends I know how difficult it is for us practicing Christians to live our faith in 2022. The common sentiment expressed at last Wednesday evening's Bible Study was – tiredness. Yes, we acknowledged that all we are forced to contend these days, the pressures of living, the challenges of keeping our families safe and providing for their needs, not to mention the political rhetoric and the nastiness that is passing for politics these days, is simply wearing us out! And yes, there is no wilderness to escape to – nowhere to run and hide. Yet our God still calls us amidst all that we are confronted with, to still live our faith, for as we reminded each other on Wednesday, our God still reigns!

As previously indicated, I accepted an invitation from Sheriff McNeil to attend a workshop for church leaders held last Monday evening at his headquarters. The Sheriff is a person of faith and never fails to remind whoever he addresses of that fact. The purpose of the gathering was to seek support for a program he wants to introduce into the school system with the blessing of the Department of Education. He has enlisted Kez McCorvey, a former standout athlete at F.S.U. who now serves as the Multi-Area Director for the Northwest Florida Region. Kez spoke passionately of the pivotal role sports can play in the lives of young people, particularly those who suffer from a want of positive role models in their lives. Having no dad at home, his coach became his dad, and the rest is history. Kez challenged us church leaders in attendance, to take our message of hope beyond our church walls, for those whom we are trying to “save” may never darken our church doors. Kez McCorvey's organization is called – Fellowship of Christian Athletes that touches/transforms millions of lives-----one heart at a time. Since 1954, FCA has been challenging coaches and athletes on the professional, college and high school levels to use the powerful platform of sports to reach every coach and every athlete with the transforming power of Jesus the Christ.
