#### **A Reading from the Acts of the Apostles (2:1-21)**

When the day of Pentecost had come, they were all together in one place. And suddenly from heaven there came a sound like the rush of a violent wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting. Divided tongues, as of fire, appeared among them, and a tongue rested on each of them. All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other languages, as the Spirit gave them ability. Now there were devout Jews from every nation under heaven living in Jerusalem. And at this sound the crowd gathered and was bewildered, because each one heard them speaking in the native language of each. Amazed and astonished, they asked, "Are not all these who are speaking Galileans? And how is it that we hear, each of us, in our own native language? Parthians, Medes, Elamites, and residents of Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya belonging to Cyrene, and visitors from Rome, both Jews and proselytes, Cretans and Arabs-- in our own languages we hear them speaking about God's deeds of power." All were amazed and perplexed, saying to one another, "What does this mean?" But others sneered and said, "They are filled with new wine." But Peter, standing with the eleven, raised his voice and addressed them, "Men of Judea and all who live in Jerusalem, let this be known to you, and listen to what I say. Indeed, these are not drunk, as you suppose, for it is only nine o'clock in the morning. No, this is what was spoken through the prophet Joel: `In the last days it will be, God declares, that I will pour out my Spirit upon all flesh,

and your sons and your daughters shall prophesy, and your young men shall see visions, and your old men shall dream dreams. Even upon my slaves, both men and women, in those days I will pour out my Spirit; and they shall prophesy. And I will show portents in the heaven above and signs on the earth below, blood, and fire, and smoky mist. The sun shall be turned to darkness and the moon to blood, before the coming of the Lord's great and glorious day. Then everyone who calls on the name of the Lord shall be saved.'"

**THE NICENE CREED**

## **FROM THE RECTOR'S DESK**

### **The Feast of Pentecost**

Pentecost is the Greek name given to the Feast of Weeks so called because it fell on the fiftieth (50) day after Passover. At that feast (Jewish) the first fruits of the corn harvest were presented (Deut. 16:9) and the giving of the Law to Moses commemorated. As the Holy spirit descended on the Apostles on this day (Acts 2:1), the Christian church borrowed the title of Pentecost, to name this festival. In the wider Anglican Communion, today's celebration is called Whitsunday, the second greatest festival in the Church. The word 'Whitsunday' was derived from the white robes that were worn by the newly baptized at Whitsun. Customarily, baptisms are done on this day in many of our Episcopal congregations and in some more traditional churches, a big birthday cake is made available to those attending mass on the day.

### **Update on the election for 9<sup>th</sup> Bishop of Florida**

As indicated previously, we were able to elect Fr. Charlie Holt a Floridian as Bishop-coadjutor on May 14<sup>th</sup> in Jacksonville. However, an objection has been raised by a group of electors who have questioned the electoral process that was used on the said day. This matter is being forwarded to the Presiding Bishop's Office for adjudication. Do pray for our Diocese especially at this time.
