We thank you, Father, for the water of Baptism. In it we are buried with Christ in his death. By it we share in his resurrection. Through it we are reborn by the Holy Spirit. Therefore in joyful obedience to your Son, we bring into his fellowship those who come to him in faith, baptizing them in the Name of the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit.

Now sanctify this water, we pray you, by the power of your Holy Spirit, that those who here are cleansed from sin and born again may continue for ever in the risen life of Jesus Christ our Savior.

## **FROM THE RECTOR'S DESK**

### **Contested Election for Bishop Elect**

We shared from the office a recent correspondence received from the Chair of the Standing Committee, the Rev. Joe Gibbes. An objection (in fact several) was raised with the conduct of the election, thereby stalling the other phases of this process. Basically, after the diocesan election, the individual receiving a two-third majority in both houses of clergy and laity, has to be approved by a similar margin in the various Standing Committees across the Episcopal Church. The final phase has to do with the House of Bishops reception/acceptance. On account of the objection, a report was submitted to the Presiding Bishop's Office and the PB in his role as arbiter, has to send that report to the Episcopal Church's Court of Review – that process can take up to 120 days. On account of these developments, the planned consecration of the Bishop-Elect will be delayed to possibly January 2023.
