Reading from the Epistle to the Hebrews (11:8-16)

By faith Abraham obeyed when he was called to set out for a place that he was to receive as an inheritance; and he set out, not knowing where he was going. By faith he stayed for a time in the land he had been promised, as in a foreign land, living in tents, as did Isaac and Jacob, who were heirs with him of the same promise. For he looked forward to the city that has foundations, whose

architect and builder is God. By faith he received power of procreation, even though he was too old—and Sarah herself was barren—because he considered him faithful who had promised. Therefore from one person, and this one as good as dead, descendants were born, "as many as the stars of heaven and as the innumerable grains of sand by the seashore." All of these died in faith without having received the promises, but from a distance they saw and greeted them. They confessed that they were strangers and foreigners on the earth, for people who speak in this way make it clear that they are seeking a homeland. If they had been thinking of the land that they had left behind, they would have had opportunity to return. But as it is, they desire a better country, that is, a heavenly one. Therefore God is not ashamed to be called their God; indeed, he has prepared a city for them.

SERMON

Reverend Hugh Chapman

THE NICENE CREED

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is seen and unseen. FROM THE RECTOR'S DESK

Celebrating our Freedoms

Tomorrow these United States of America will celebrate our independence from Great Britain – and we perhaps will take the time between mouthfuls of good hometown cooking and whatever is the preferred libation, to give thanks to God for setting us free. Initially that freedom was only for a certain ethnic group, but as our democracy expanded, the constitution offered guarantees that we now collectively enjoy. So let us celebrate this experiment that has lasted 246 years and make sure its ramifications are preserved for all time to come. Happy July 4th to all.

Christianity in Crisis

A former parishioner of mine (who will remain nameless) is often sending me reading material that is most times edifying and certainly provocative. After a certain amount of wrestling, I have decided to share this latest post entitled – when Jesus is MIA with you, here is what she wrote:-

“The religion that we grew up knowing as Christianity has morphed in something unrecognizable and untenable. While that is not true of all who call themselves Christians, it is true for perhaps the loudest and most extreme of those who use this label to cover a wide variety of fearful, hateful attitudes and behaviors and who increasingly are seen by our sensationalist media to represent the faith as a whole.

That, in turn, increasingly make folks like me, who sincerely seek to know Jesus and His Way as best we can discern it, loathe to identify ourselves with that label. I have often said about this confusion of religion with misogyny, homophobia, racism, and hostility to immigrants, that whatever else it might be about, it is not about Jesus. Indeed, in most versions of white nationalism, in both its evangelical and reactionary Catholic/Christian version, Jesus is simply missing in action.

Here is an excerpt from John Pavlovitz's take on it. (Check out the link-<https://johnpavlovitz.com>) People have said that the MAGA Evangelical movement has high jacked Jesus, but I don't believe that's true. They have highjacked the word Christian. Jesus is of no use to them (no reflections of his teachings are found in their pronouncements). I'm not sure what all this angry, chest-thumping, bullying, “don't tread on me” thing that we have come to call Christianity is, but here's what I do know:-

It isn't the Gospel
It isn't the Good News for the poor and marginalized
It isn't the Prince of Peace
It isn't the perfect love that casts out fear
It isn't Jesus by any measure.

Instead, it is a toxic cocktail of power, control, fear, nationalism, and white privilege –and it looks more like the bloated opulence of Rome, than the early Church that resisted it.”
