

Althemese Pemberton Barnes Park Dedicated

Last Tuesday, the City of Tallahassee, dedicated in her honor, the Althemese Pemberton Barnes Park at Smokey Hollow. It was a fitting tribute to our sister Althemese who has been a leader on historic presentations for decades. She is the founder and Executive Director Emeritus of the John G. Riley House Center and Museum and was instrumental in the establishment of the Florida African American Heritage Preservation Network. She is also responsible for the publication of more than 200 historical documentaries and oral histories. Additionally she helped to convene the inaugural "Journey to Emancipation" Conference to raise awareness about Florida's Emancipation Day of May 20, 1865. Althemese of whom we are truly proud, also led the Smokey Hollow Community Historic Preservation Project to its completion.
