

## **ANNOUNCEMENTS**

### **Call to Prayer**

As we reported recently, there will be just three (3) candidates vying for the position of Bishop Coadjutor of the Diocese:- The Rev. Canon Beth Tjoflat, The Rev. Canon Dr. Miguel Rosada and The Rev. Charlie Holt. The Standing Committee plans to have a Meet and Greet session scheduled for Saturday, November 12, 2022, at the Camp Weed Pavilion in the morning. The Committee also plans to provide the diocese with a video that will provide more information regarding the process by which we will elect the new bishop and seek to answer any questions that are still out there. The plan is also to have a third video next month based on questions submitted the Committee. Finally, each member of the Diocese, lay and ordained is being asked to be part of a Lenten-style fast leading up to November 19<sup>th</sup>.

### **A special Request**

Historic Emmanuel Episcopal Church, founded in 1880 and built after the Civil War, is seeking to preserve its historic legacy. Plans include:-a. the replacement of sill beams and rotted exterior wood. b. the caulking of windows c. the painting of the exterior etc. The membership is seeking financial and other donations to assist with their planned renovation. They have asked for as little as \$25.00. I would like for us as a parish consider this request and respond accordingly.

### **Christmas Kids Camp**

The vestry has given its blessing for a Christmas Kids Camp to be held in the Fellowship Hall on the following days:- November 26<sup>th</sup>, December 3<sup>rd</sup>, December 10<sup>th</sup> & 17<sup>th</sup> and 24<sup>th</sup>. This idea is the brainchild of vestry person Kim Douglas. Each session will be held on Saturdays from 10:00 am to 2:00 pm with a \$40 fee per student.

### **An Important Victory**

The Capital Area Justice Ministry is laying claim to an important victory after the City Commission on Wednesday evening at their monthly meeting, voted unanimously to adopt and fund the Gun Violence Intervention (CVI) framework that will be implemented in 2023. This intervention program has been utilized across the country in cities larger than Tallahassee, as city leaders, clergy and advocates for justice come together to combat youth violence. This is an important step forward for us as a community as we hear daily reports of gun violence in certain sectors of our city, unnerving lots of us, ultimately, we want to arrest that dangerous trend of school to the criminal justice system for a significant number at risk youth.

## FROM THE RECTOR'S DESK

### Being persistent Pays

One of my favorite stories from the gospels, is the one that Jesus told about a woman who refused to be ignored, and simply would not take no for an answer. Our Lord says that this woman, seeking justice, kept coming back to a judge who was clearly aggravated by her persistence. The gospel writer says, 'that she wore out the judge.' He finally told those serving in his court, to give her what she wanted! The Lord Jesus told this story no doubt to remind his hearers (and us) about the need to keep praying and interceding, and as St. Paul the Apostle would say, "and not lose heart." There are so many discouraging situations we daily encounter that could cause us to easily throw up our hands, walk away, and not persist.

Well, the Capital Area Justice Ministry led by Leah Wiley, chose to do as Jesus suggested in that story and kept making representation to the City Commissioners and Mayor, about finding solutions to the gun violence epidemic threatening our collective peace of mind. Their ask – a million dollars to fund a Gun Violence Initiative to make us all safe! Our teams did the research, working with other justice ministries from across the country – taking the time to interview City Council officials, listening patiently to what was done before and how previous attempts floundered for want of public support. Our Gun Violence Committee simply refused to be deterred but instead seized every opportunity whenever we found a sympathetic ear, to make our case. So last Wednesday when the Commissioners met, no doubt with their eyes on the calendar, they voted unanimously to approve the proposal that will be implemented in its entirety, come 2023. While CAJM should rightly celebrate this victory, there are so many other issues to be addressed like affordable housing, just to name one that cannot and should not be ignored. Still too many are made to sleep in their cars, or exposed to the elements. Fall is already here! So here's a personal appeal to all of our church family – for as you know I serve as the vice-president of CAJM. Become part of SMAA's Justice Ministry Network, as we seek to make Tallahassee the city that our God intended. The beautiful thing about CAJM is that we work beside each other regardless of political affiliation, doctrinal differences, or our several ethnicities. Our cause is justice – justice for all regardless of zip-code, or economic status. Beloved let us together make Tallahassee a place where our children and grandchildren can grow up and live in peace.
