

FROM THE RECTOR'S DESK

Letting the Spirit have its Way

I used to have a New Testament/Greek professor at Seminary, Canon Dr. Harry Sawyer, who hailed from Sierre Leone in Africa. Canon Sawyer as we fondly called him, used to like to say, "the Holy Spirit is a confusionist! Whenever He shows up, He disrupts, and as we read in the Acts of the Apostles, turns everything upside down - creating new expectations but often disappointing a lot of folks who think that they know the mind of God." This understanding of the work of the Holy Spirit of God, is there in plain sight, if we carefully read sacred scripture. In short, there is no predictability, no certainty, as to what God will do, what He wants to do in our lives and certainly in His Church. I remembered Canon Sawyer after perusing the recent communication coming from the Standing Committee of the Diocese, regarding the objection raised about the conduct of the November 19th poll held at Camp Weed. I remind you that this was the second attempt to elect a Coadjutor Bishop, and if this challenge is upheld, then we are going to have to ask ourselves, we Episcopalians in this diocese an important question – are we seeking God's will or our own? Is this about God's agenda for His church, or us trying to satisfy our own preferences disregarding what is best for the future, and the Diocese of Florida. This is no attempt to blow my own horn, but when the question was broached about a second election so quickly following the May debacle – just to remind you, the Committee of Review which advises the President Bishop, said that we improperly conducted that election, I suggested that maybe we should pause, certainly take more than two weeks to seek candidates – in fact seek the will of the Lord. I was told that we are dealing with a small window – in other words, we were out of time! My reason for suggesting a pause, was that I was sensing some unease to put it mildly, and thought perhaps we as a Diocesan family should "reason together" as Isaiah would say, come to an understanding, maybe a better appreciation of what kind of Diocese we want to be. Yes, whether we will acknowledge our brokenness, and whatever else bedevil's the "koinonia", the fellowship we ought to have as a diocesan family, perhaps acknowledge some more our diversity or lack thereof and the fact that some of us feel excluded and that such exclusion does not bode well for us working side by side for the sake of the gospel!

What has transpired, meaning the objection placed before the Standing Committee, is living testimony that the tug-o-war we have, is playing havoc with our efforts to elect/select Bishop Howard's successor. I fear that if we do not deal prayerfully and intentionally with this schism (potential) we run the risk of having the disillusioned on both sides of the divide, take their marbles and go home! Pray with me that this does not happen and in fact we will seek to discern God's will for our beloved Diocese before it is too late.
