Feast of the Holy Name

Today we celebrate as a church, the Most Holy Name of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. Our Roman Catholic brethren often name churches after this feast day. On this eighth day of the Christmas, I share with you this prayer that a friend passed on to me:-
