FROM THE RECTOR'S DESK

Looking back on the Feast of the Epiphany

On Friday last, Catholics and Episcopalians everywhere celebrated the Feast of the Epiphany, our Lord's manifestation to the Gentiles. This celebration which originated in the East, dates back to the 3rd century, and was held in honor of Jesus' baptism. Indeed it was ranked with Easter and Pentecost as one of the three principal festivals of the Church. One of its main features in the East was the solemn blessing of water. This celebration was introduced into the Western Church but instead became associated with the manifestation of the Christ to the Gentiles – i.e. the visit of the Magi – the wise men from the East. In 1955 both the Octave and Vigil of the Epiphany were abolished, but the Sunday after Epiphany was made a separate feast of Jesus' Baptism. In the United Kingdom, the Sovereign makes offerings of gold, frankincense, and myrrh in the Chapel Royal on the day of the feast.

In the midst of Life

I sometimes long for the 1928 Prayer Book, because of the Elizabethan language that permeates it – like music to the ear! This line from the burial service – in the midst of life we are in death – proclaims a timeless truth, indeed a somber reminder of the frailty of our human nature – yes death comes suddenly upon us, as I suppose it did upon Dr. Elsie Crowell. As I have indicated elsewhere, Elsie and I spoke not so long ago and planned on having a chicken dinner from Popeyes – it was not to be. Like me, Charlie Clark was in a state of shock when he heard of Elsie's passing, for the two of them, chatted on the breezeway just recently! To be truthful, I am still reeling from Elsie's death, so I could well imagine her family. Please do keep the Crowell family in your prayers as they deal with their unexpected loss. May Elsie rest in peace and rise in glory.
