FROM THE RECTOR'S DESK

The Presiding Bishop's Plea

I hope we all took the time to read the Presiding Bishop's message, following the brutal beating of Tyree Nichols (just 29) and his subsequent death, at the hands of five police officers in Memphis, who were supposed to serve and protect him! Archbishop Curry reminded us of two texts, one found in the prophecies of Jeremiah and the other in Matthew's gospel, both of which are words of lament, as senseless and cowardly actions resulted in the death of innocent individuals. Bishop Curry, the scholar that he is, connected this idea of "weeping mothers" in scripture with those of Emmett Till, Trayvon Martin, Michael Brown, George Floyd, Breanna Taylor, Ahmaud Arbery and many others. Curry continued – a family grieves, a community fears, and a nation is ashamed! Like the psalmist David, he too cries out, "How long, O Lord, how long? There have been calls since this sickening and absolutely dreadful event, for better training for law enforcement. Other pundits have chosen to cast blame, saying, it is a recruitment problem, we are simply not hiring the best qualified persons to patrol our streets - and there is the ridiculous notion out there linking the defund of the police idea that somehow caused/resulted in the barbaric behavior of those rogue cops, because of their bottled-up anger! Still others have tried to actually rationalize what we saw on our television screens - a young black body being battered/brutalized by mindless beasts all dressed up in police gear, purporting to protect the Memphis community from street carnage. The cynics are trying to say that that's what black on black violence looks like close up!

It is Black History Month again and no doubt there will be a procession of speakers and preachers who again will try to remind us of the inhumane treatment that was meted out to our forebears – the 1619 project documents that story so well. Right here in Tallahassee, a rally is being arranged to protest changes in the AP Black Studies curriculum and the "anti-woke" agenda in our public school system – another outrageous situation if I ever saw one! So our children will be educated about what occurred on the European continent, but we have to filter what happened right here in America. I am not going to suggest that the protest planned for Wednesday 15th is not important – indeed it ought to galvanize us into action – please go if you are able. Of more paramount concern, is the fact that we seem to have less and less regard for the sanctity of human life. Indeed that is what I heard in Bishop Curry's plea.
