

FROM THE RECTOR'S DESK

A Report from the Vestry

The SMAA Vestry held its regular monthly meeting on Monday, February 13, 2023. The Vestry would like to share some of the more pertinent actions taken during that meeting. These actions represent continued upgrades and hardening to our facilities.

- ✓ Parish Hall Roofing System: The Vestry approved a request from the Jr. Warden to initiate bidding proposals for roof repairs and upgrades. These bid proposals will be considered at the next monthly meeting.
- ✓ Tree Removal Request: The Vestry approved a bid of \$1,200 to have two palm trees removed on the west exposure of the Parish Hall. The removal of these trees are required as part of the repairs noted above.
- ✓ HVAC Repairs: Repairs on the compressor were completed and accepted on the Sanctuary system by January 14, 2023. There were no charges for this work.
- ✓ Facility Security: New cameras and monitors were installed on the grounds and in the Administrative offices. The Vestry authorized payment of \$5,690 for these upgrades.
- ✓ Facility IT Upgrades: The Vestry approved a bid of \$3,628.01 to have all Parish Information Technology linked and enrolled into one business platform.
- ✓ (NOTE): The Facility Security and Facility IT Upgrades funds represent a very generous donation by a member of the SMAA Parish.
