

FROM THE RECTOR'S DESK

A Word about Lent – the Fast of 40 days

In the first three centuries of the Church's life, the period of fasting in preparation for Easter did not as a rule, exceed two or three days. In fact the first mention of a period of forty days occurs in the Canons of Nicaea (AD 325). The custom may have originated in the prescribed Fast of candidates for baptism, and the number of 40 was evidently suggested by the 40 days' fasts of Moses, Elijah and especially Jesus. In the Eastern Church, the Lenten Fast was observed during seven weeks, but as Saturdays and Sundays (except Holy Saturday) were exempt, that only left 36 actual fast days. The Western Church on the other hand, fasted for six weeks amounting to 36 days, as they normally left out the Sundays. Apparently in Jerusalem the actual 40 days were observed as early as the 4th century where believers fasted five days for eight weeks. As our scholars have pointed out, in Rome, the original Fast was for 40 days from the First Sunday in Lent to Maundy Thursday, with the Fasts of Good Friday and Holy Saturday being independent. During the early centuries of Christendom, the observance of the Fast was very strict – only one meal a day, taken towards the end of the day – and in most places the eating of meat and fish (even eggs) were absolutely forbidden. However in the ninth century onwards and in the Western world, the practice began to be considerably relaxed. The hour for breaking the fast was gradually moved forward to three o'clock in the afternoon, and by the 15th century, it had become a general custom, even for religious, to eat at noon. Prior to that, these communities allowed only a beverage during the day, but by the 13th century, a light meal was encouraged.

In the Western Church, the penitential character of Lent was reflected in the liturgy, such as the use of purple vestments and the omission of the Alleluias and the Glorias at the Eucharist.

Finally, Lent is generally observed as a time of penance by abstaining from festivities, by the giving of alms and the engaging of spiritual exercises – the reading of scripture and meditative and contemplative exercises. Closer to our time, more emphasis has been placed on these aspects of discipline rather than on physical fasting. The observance of Lent continued in the Church of England after the Reformation and is prescribed by the Book of Common Prayer and for us Episcopalians also. **Fr. Hugh+**
