

Doing Something More

In our small group discussion last Wednesday evening after a stellar presentation by Dr. Neil James, I made passing reference to an educator/organist/lay preacher who served in my first parish back in the 80's in Guyana, South America. Edwin Elijah Burnett came to St. John-the-Baptist all because we had acquired an organ and had no one to play it! He showed up at my office door one day, alleging that some women of the church were harassing him – actually demanding that he become our organist! To this day, I remember his delightful humor and uncanny ability to connect with everyone regardless of race, gender, class, or creed. He used to say that we Anglicans/Episcopalians should not only fast, pray and do acts of mercy, but be prepared to go way beyond what the observance of Lent required. Instead we should do significantly more, thereby enhancing the lives of all whom we encounter in this journey we call – LIFE.
