

On account of a joint effort between SMAA and the Union of Black Episcopalians, some one hundred (100) of our homeless brethren, who gather at Grace Mission every Sunday for both spiritual and bodily sustenance, will receive a warm meal today. Actually, the chef is away on sick leave, so the four (4) parishes here in the city are stepping up – St. John's, Advent, Holy Comforter and us. I remind you of what Jesus says will happen at the Final Judgment (Matthew 25), when all humanity stands before God. He will ask whether we fed the hungry, clothe the naked, provided shelter for the homeless, visited the sick and those in prison and even offered a cup of cold water to those who were thirsty.
