FROM THE RECTOR'S DESK

Standing in the Gap

The dramatic rescue of the Hebrew slaves at the Red Sea (Exodus 14 ff) epitomizes what we often describe as divine intervention. The biblical writer(s) captured the terror that engulfed the fleeing children of Israel – before them was the Red Sea (or Reed Sea) and behind them was Pharaoh's chariots and horsemen in full stride. We know that story so well - the Israelites blamed Moses for what was about to befall them – "what have you done to us? You should have left us alone to serve the Egyptians!" To which Moses responded, "Do not be afraid, stand firm and see the deliverance that the Lord will accomplish for you today." God himself intervened to rescue His people – indeed His divine presence was symbolized by both the "angel of God" and the "pillar of cloud", the one going before and the other right behind, so there was God being for them, a protective shield. Then the writer says, Moses stood with his arms extended in the form of a cross, foreshadowing the salvation that was to be wrought on behalf of all mankind, when Jesus extended his arms on Calvary's Cross, much later on. It is not sacrilegious to suggest that we, mere mortals, should sometimes have to stand in the gap for others, lest they be crushed by forces ready to annihilate them. Tomorrow (March 27th), The Capital Area Justice Ministry will challenge all attending the Nehemiah Assembly to do the same for those whose lives have been upended by gun violence, unaffordable housing and a system that allows often silly and precocious behavior, to result in unnecessary misdemeanor charges for our teenagers. So let us go stand in the gap for the most vulnerable in our midst.

Our Altar Guild does exemplary work always. Much of what they do is hidden from our view, simply because it is all preparatory. So they prepare the altar for worship and decorate as well as at their expense!! They do all of this and more without complaining, recognizing that this is God's special call upon their lives.
