

FROM THE RECTOR'S DESK

We lifted justice higher!

We lifted justice higher at our Capital Area Justice Ministry (CAJM) annual Nehemiah Action on March 27th! Despite the rain and long entry lines, we packed the Old West Enrichment Center once again. Over 600 of our neighbors, family, friends, and ministry partners came out to *bend the long arc of the moral universe toward justice in the capital area*. The current religious and political climate says we shouldn't have been able to unite around our diversity to get things done -- but we defied the status quo and did it anyway. THAT'S GOOD NEWS!

The night of March 27, we got into what the late, great John Lewis called "good trouble". Click <u>here</u> for the Action program and campaign research. See our pre-Action press coverage <u>here</u>.

- We carved a pathway for very and extremely low-income families to find decent rental
 housing they can afford by getting a majority of our city commission (our Mayor was absent) to commit to the following:
 - Establishing, in consultation with CAJM and other interested parties, a new incentive financing program to increase the numbers of new rental units set aside per year for verylow and extremely-low income households;
 - 2. Allocating at least \$5 million per year in recurring income to finance the program
 - 3. Directing city staff to develop options for generating \$12 million to seed the program.

For restaurant, hotel, and childcare workers, fire dispatchers, reserve police officers, crossing guards, and others earning less than \$38,000/year. THAT'S GOOD NEWS!

• We achieved major progress in keeping our youth out of the criminal justice system. Our follow-up and testimonies advocating for more issuance of civil citations instead of arresting youth for misdemeanors by law enforcement agencies in the county led Sheriff Walter McNeil to commit not only to increasing civil citation issuance to 80% of eligible youth but to also articulate his goal to increase that to 100%! He also committed to convening a meeting with Police Chief Lawrence Revell and State Attorney Jack Campbell, who were absent from the Nehemiah Action, to come to agreement on additional policies and protocols to significantly increase use of civil citations.

For children and those who love them, THAT'S GOOD NEWS!
